




A Reading from the Book of Sirach


A READING FROM THE LETTER OF PAUL TO THE COLOSSIANS


PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Knights of Columbus Trinity Council 5467 2021 7th Annual Coats for Kids Sets A New Record Distributes 600 Coats



The Trinity Council 7th Annual Coats for Kids program set a new record for the sixth consecutive year. The program started in the summer and recently concluded with the final deliveries. This year the council distributed a record number of 600 new boys and girls winter coats, surpassing the 552 coats delivered in 2020. The coats were distributed to twenty-five schools, churches and service organizations, including one new group: Behavioral Wellness Health. Since the program started in 2015, the council has distributed 2,544 coats in seven years.

A MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP LEONARD P. BLAIR

We are all aware of the reports of devastation that resulted from the massive tornado that hit the state of Kentucky and other areas as well.

I would like to share with you the following notice from the USCCB which recommends that contributions be directed through *Catholic Charities USA* in the event you would like to take up a special collection for this purpose.

I join you in praying for all those who have died or are suffering as a result of this natural disaster. WASHINGTON - Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and Archbishop Paul S. Coakley of Oklahoma City, chairman of the Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, have issued the following statement after tornadoes tore through multiple states in the South and Midwest late Friday into early Saturday morning.

In their statement, Archbishops Gomez and Coakley call for prayer and assistance for all those who were in the path of the storm:

"It is heartbreaking to see the destruction and devastation brought by the tornadoes that tore through the South and Midwest overnight. During this Advent season where we await in joyful anticipation for the birth of our Lord, we pray for those who have been injured, for those who have lost their lives, and for their grieving families and communities. May those who have been impacted by these storms find peace, comfort, and hope in our faith and in God's endless love. We also pray for the emergency responders and those who have begun the work of providing for the needs of the impacted in these communities in the recovery efforts. We entrust all our brothers and sisters in harm's way to our Blessed Mother, and we ask for her continued protection and for her intercession in comforting those who are suffering.

MARY'S PIVOTAL ROLE IN HISTORY



Advent and Christmas are primordially Marian seasons, as the Church focuses on reflecting on the Blessed Mother's role in God's plan for our salvation. (CCC 488-493) As her children, we contemplate how much this young woman desired to do God's will. Moreover, she constantly teaches us about how Christ should be the most important person in our lives. Who we are, what we have, every blessing, every grace we have ever received, comes from him through her. (cf. CCC 968-970) These days, we joyfully celebrate the plan of salvation that the books of the Old Testament, in foretelling Jesus' birth, "gradually bring into clearer light the figure of a woman, the Mother of the Redeemer." (Lumen Gentium 55) In this divine plan, the Blessed Virgin was involved

in many wonderful ways in the mysteries of Jesus' childhood and manifestations. First, by a virginal birth, Mary brought forth the Son (Lk 2:7), showed him to the shepherds (Lk 2:16-19) and the Magi (Mt 2:11) and presented him in the Temple as she offered him to the Lord. (Lk 2:22-39) Then, with tremendous challenges and uncertainty, she and Joseph took Jesus into exile in Egypt (Mt 2:13-15) and searched for him when he was lost. (Lk 2:45-46)

She led their busy life in their home of Nazareth. (Lk 2:51-52) Decisively, at the wedding feast in Cana, trusting entirely in her son's caring heart, Mary asked him for a favor on behalf of the bride and groom, and Jesus performed his first miracle, "and so revealed his glory." (Jn 2:11) Among our many spiritual writers, St. Augustine declared that Mary "conceived (Christ) in her heart before she conceived him in her womb" (Sermo 25, 7; PL 38, 937), praising her faith and obedience as our model in her spiritual relationship with Jesus. (CCC 144, 148, 494)

Mary's motherhood originates from her unique role and dignity, for "none like her was seen before and none thereafter." (cf. CCC 963) Likewise, the Virgin's power of unceasing intercession for God's people comes from her divine motherhood. (CCC 495, 2677) Therefore, like her, we are to seek out and treasure the things that are God's. We must never forget that Mary's pivotal role in salvation history continues to the present time. If we profess that we can pray for each other as members of the body of Christ (cf. 1 Thes 5:25; 2 Thes 1:11), we would surely want the prayers of her whom all generations call blessed. (Lk 1:48) She is the mother of Divine Providence, a mother who cares for her children, entrusted to her by Jesus on Good Friday.

Mary is the "beautiful dawn" preceding Christ the "glorious Day," for the Father willed that the Mother would precede the incarnate Son in the history of salvation. Therefore, as the announcement of the motherhood of Mary by the archangel Gabriel heralded and prepared for the Incarnation, Advent and Christmas provide us with the opportunity of deepening our understanding of Mary's maternal mediation for all of us.

Pope Francis concludes the Year of St. Joseph

At the conclusion of the Angelus on December 8, 2021, Pope Francis concluded the Jubilee Year dedicated to Saint Joseph. He also announced that the Jubilee Year dedicated to Our Lady of Loreto would end in Loreto on December 10.

St. Joseph and his wife the Virgin Mary, the pontiff stressed, are "guides on the path of holiness." He thanked all those who have brought to life these years of celebrations dedicated to Joseph and Mary—the Holy Family—in 2021.

With a decree published on December 8, 2020, the Holy See had announced plans to dedicate 2021 to St. Joseph, protector of the Holy Family. To conclude this Year—during which all the dioceses of the world were called to pray to the adoptive father of Jesus—Pope Francis began a catechesis on St. Joseph at the end of November that he is expected to continue in the coming weeks.
