



OPENING HYMN: GOD WE PRAISE YOU


But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes. THE WORD OF THE LORD.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. THE GOSPEL OF THE LORD.

My favorite passage from the Sacred Scriptures is from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Romans 12:12 – "Rejoice in hope, be patient under trial, and persevere in prayer." It is the ongoing and everyday relationship that we have with Our Lord Jesus, made manifest by the Gospel and through the sacraments, and sustained by honest prayer. The struggles certainly come, big ones and small ones, as they are part of our humanity. We know that well. What we also know -- as we have celebrated at Christmas -- Our Lord Jesus takes on our humanity so that we too can be holy.

Last weekend, I began my pastoral ministry on the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord Jesus. I realized that this great moment of salvation history marked the beginning of the public ministry of Our Savior. That type of connection certainly helps me to stay in a feeling of joy and hopefulness. Thank you to everyone for their kind welcome and encouragement. We are never alone on the journey of faith.


what I have done to you?", "Do you take offense at this?", "Do you love Me?".






