

And then when we regularly give that few minutes per day to God, God responds. God works in our lives. He reveals the love that he has for us.


And, oh, how do our lives change when we finally accept and embrace the all encompassing, unconditional love that He has for each of us. Let us foster and cherish our relationship with God, Our Father.

Let us end with a quotation from Ruth Burrows, OCD, a Carmelite Nun who resides in England. She has written several books about prayer, including *Essence of Prayer*. "Prayer. We take the word for granted but ought we to do so? What do we mean by prayer? What does the word mean in the Christian context? Almost always when we talk about prayer we are thinking of something we do and, from that standpoint, questions, problems, confusion, discouragement, illusions multiply. For me, it is of fundamental importance to correct this view. Our Christian knowledge assures us that prayer is essentially what *God* does, how God addresses us, looks at us. It is not primarily something we are doing to God, something we are giving to God but what God is doing for us. And what God is doing for us is giving us the divine Self in love."

Once in a while you hear something that resonates deeply with you and causes you to pause and reflect. This is one such story. I wanted to share it with you because in the midst of all that is going on in our world today with our many struggles and challenges, let us remember the precious gifts that we have:

A wise woman who was traveling in the mountains found a precious stone in a stream. The next day she met another traveler who was hungry. The wise woman opened her bag to share her food. The hungry traveler saw the precious stone in her bag and asked the woman to give it to him. She did so without hesitation. The traveler left, rejoicing in his good fortune. He knew that the stone was worth enough to give him security for a lifetime. But a few days later he came back to return the stone to the wise woman.

"I've been thinking," he said, "I know how valuable the stone is, but I gave it back in the hope that you can give me something even more precious. Give me what you have within you that enabled you to give me that stone."

One would think that the man would be pleased to get that precious stone, but he realized that the woman who so generously gave it to me had something far more precious. It reminds me of Jesus' Beatitudes when He says, 'Blessed are the poor, the suffering, the prosecuted.' By earthly standards, these people are not blessed at all, but in God's heavenly kingdom, they are. Perhaps Jesus was telling them that they possess something far more precious than valuable earthly 'stones.'





Spiritual Direction Available

Spiritual direction is a space and place to unpack and notice, through conversations with a prayerful companion, personal encounters with the Jesus for whom each and every one of us matters. The very act of holy listening and sharing that occurs within spiritual direction sessions is an experience of Jesus meeting us and entering our life in the world, where we are, as we are.

People meet with a spiritual director for many reasons. Perhaps they want to grow in their relationship with God and are seeking guidance as to how to start their prayer lives or how to take their prayer lives deeper. Or maybe they are trying to discern an invitation from God to minister in some way. Or maybe they are in the middle of having to make a major life decision or transition. Perhaps they are experiencing some crisis of faith. No matter what draws someone to seek spiritual direction, the conversations between prayerful companions always lead back to the One who draws a person to seek spiritual companionship in the first place—the Living Spirit of God.

If you desire to "find God in all things", Deacon Don Ross is available to be a prayerful companion on your journey to the fullness of life in Christ. 

THE THOMAS MERTON CENTER was founded in 1974 by a group of concerned individuals who saw a need for services to the economically disadvantaged people in the city of Bridgeport. As the times have changed and the needs of the people served have changed, Merton House has developed programs to address issues such as housing, nutritional needs, healthcare needs, parenting issues and youth at risk. The Thomas Merton House of Hospitality provides breakfast, lunch, and day shelter to approximately 210 people each day Monday through Saturday and serves about 85,000 meals a year.

The youth of St. Stephen are planning to provide 2,400 sandwiches over the next 12 months to the Merton House Soup Kitchen. It's only with the generosity of the people of St. Stephen that this can be accomplished! Thank you in advance for supporting this important ministry of the youth of St. Stephen Parish.
