We have received letters from our scholarship students. Four of our students have either graduated or will graduate very soon. Statements like, "I am deeply grateful to God and You", "wishing you many blessings" were the norm in their final letters to us. These students have aspirations to be nurses, teachers, and more. Some would like to go on to college but may not have the financial ability to do so.

Our other students continue to attend school but all classes are held virtually as the Pandemic continues to grip Guatemala. This has made their education much more difficult. Several expressed having no face to face contact with their teacher being very hard. Additionally, their families are struggling financially and many of the students are doing what work they can find to help supplement family income. There have been deaths in student families associated with the Covid 19 outbreak. Additionally, the government of Guatemala has banned activities normally celebrated during the month of September (the anniversary of the nation). The students miss normal activities as we do here in the United States like soccer, being with friends, etc. Please keep Abner, Ana, Norma, Selvin, Marco, Brian, Edson, Maria, Juana, and Luis in your prayers.





Saint of the Week

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.
