#### Dear Parishioners,

Last week, Governor McKee instituted a mask mandate for indoor public spaces with a capacity of more than 250 people. Although our seating capacity at Saint Joseph Church is below that threshold, Bishop Tobin has responded by encouraging Catholics to wear a mask when attending Holy Mass or other church services. He did state that no individual should be turned away from Mass or singled out if they choose not to wear a mask. As an act of charity, I invite parishioners to wear a mask if they are able for Mass attendance.

On the following page, please take a moment to read a letter I received this week. With the Giving Tree donations, our parish provided over \$7,500 in gift cards to 70 boys, girls and their parents. Beyond that, we provided St. Vincent de Paul with \$1,000 to assist families this holiday season and assisted several more families connected to our community with another \$1,000. Finally, please note that January 1st is the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Because it falls on a Saturday, it <u>is not</u> a holy day of obligation. We will have Mass at 9AM on January 1st to honor our Lady. There <u>will not</u> be a vigil Mass on Friday evening. I hope you're able to join us.


