

From Fr. Varghese's Desk



Well, it's that time again—time for New Year's Resolutions. Here are ten challenging suggestions drawn from quotes of our Holy Father Pope Francis (5 this week, and 5 next week)—I pray one of them will stir you:

1. <u>Don't gossip</u>. For Pope Francis, gossip is one of the evilest activities. He says when we gossip, "we are doing what Judas did. . .We begin to tear the other person to pieces. Every time we judge our brother in our hearts or worse when we speak badly of them with others, we are murdering Christians. There is no such thing as innocent gossip."

2. Don't throw leftover food away. Pope Francis wrote, "We should all remember... that throwing food away is like stealing from the tables of the poor, the hungry! I encourage everyone to reflect on the problem of thrown away and wasted food to identify ways and means that, by seriously addressing this issue, are a vehicle of solidarity and sharing with the needy."

3. <u>Make time for others</u>. Despite his busy schedule, Pope Francis takes the time to call or send notes to strangers. "If the Pope can find time to be kind to others, if he can pause to say thank you, if he can take a moment and make someone feel appreciated, then so can I. So, can we," wrote Fr. James Martin, who received a note of thanks from the pope.

4. <u>Choose the 'humbler' purchase</u>. Our Pope warns against materialism: "Certainly, possessions, money, and power can give a momentary thrill, the illusion of being happy, but they end up possessing us and making us always want to have more, never satisfied. 'Put on Christ' in your life, place your trust in him, and you will never be disappointed!"

5. <u>Meet the poor 'in the flesh'</u>. "It is not enough," wrote Pope Francis, "to mediate this commitment through institutions, which obviously help because they have a multiplying effect, but that is not enough. They do not excuse us from our establishing personal contact with the needy. The sick must be cared for, even when we find them repulsive and repugnant. Those in prison must be visited. Charity that does not change the situation of the poor isn't enough." Great food for thought from our Holy Father. Stay tuned for 5 more challenges next week.

HOUSE BLESSING FOR EPIPHANY

The Blessing of Homes at Prayer of Blessing Bless, + OLord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. After the prayers of the blessing are recited, the initials of the Magi are inscribed upon the doors of the home with the blessed chalk. (The initials, C, M, B, can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house".) Example: 20 + C + M + B + 22
