Dear Parishioners,

I find it hard to believe that this is already the last weekend in January. It seems that we just took down Christmas trees and in fact we did just dispose of the last lingering poinsettias of the season. We like to rush things and get the holiday season started early each year, but we also need to recoup after the hustle and bustle, readjusting to the more ordinary days of week to week living. However, there has been nothing ordinary about the past few weeks. We did have a transition of power in the presidency keeping with our 232 history of presidents leading the country, but it was anything but ordinary and peaceful this time around. Gratefully Inauguration Day itself was peaceful by all accounts.

Speaking of peace, I really appreciate most parishioner's cooperation in temporarily amending the Sign of Peace as the covid pandemic continues. Please know I am not trying to dampen community but trying to keep everyone as safe as possible. It was initially advised to skip the Sign of Peace aside from the exchange with the presider. I think this is a good middle ground keeping everyone facing the same direction and not tempted to touch others around them. I find it ironic that in my own life history growing up in a parish decades before covid, because of the pastor's desire for expediency with Mass, one of the things he did was institute everyone kneeling and praying for peace. I always found it odd and likely not exactly what Jesus expected a community to do, just the opposite in fact, being even more stoic and focused on simply getting through Mass. Gratefully that changed with the next pastor to the disgruntlement of many who simply do not like change and others who liked not having to touch others. At least we are not doing what it was originally called, the Kiss of Peace, imagine that with others than your immediate family or spouse! That is why Jesus said to Judas, "You betray the Son of Man with a kiss." Thank goodness some things have changed in the Church.

Many of you have inquired about how the parish is doing financially now that we are halfway through the current fiscal year that runs from July 1<sup>st</sup> through June 30<sup>th</sup>. The Parish Finance Council met a couple weeks ago and reviewed the December financials and overall were very pleased all things considered. Overall, while weekly collections have often fallen behind weekly budgeted predictions, fund-raising has done very well so far this year during the October Raffle, first and hopefully ever virtual Holly Fair, and Annual Special Appeal. We have done a great job decreasing overall spending in trying to maintain a balanced budget. We budgeted for many more Faith Formation students than enrolled for the year. Decreased tuition continues to be reflected in the financials but we also have decreased expenses offsetting the unanticipated loss. Many parishioners are doing well dropping their weekly offering in the baskets in church, sending in or dropping off donations, and we have seen an increase in online giving as well. You will soon be receiving an end-of-the-year statement of your individual or family support of the parish for the calendar year ending in December. Thank you for your generous support. We have two major fundraisers left and budgeted for this fiscal year, Sponsor-A-Day and hopefully the Golf Tournament that will likely be delayed into next fiscal year. You may have already received the Sponsor-A-Day mailing with an enclosed Lenten bookmark highlighting parish offerings and suggested resources for Lent that begins with Ash Wednesday on February 17<sup>th</sup>. Thank you for filling out the enclosed card and dropping it in the collection, sending it in, dropping it off, or sponsoring a day(s) choosing the corresponding online fund.

While our communal Lenten journey will be better this year with some of us gathering in person throughout the season, it will still be far from normal. I cannot envision having the fun Fish Bakes nor the inspiring Living Stations of the Cross brought to life by our parish teens. However, we will come together and continue streaming our weekend Masses and weekly Stations of the Cross. The camera is limited in its viewing angle so not every station will be visible, but you will be able to hear and pray along. In anticipation of Ash Wednesday, if you have old palms, please bring them with you to Mass and place them in the big blue bin or drop them by the parish center by Valentine's Day, Sunday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. I will burn them, sift the ashes from bits of unburned palm, and be ready for February 17<sup>th</sup>. Until then, keep living into this carnival season leading up to Mardi Gras on Tuesday, February 16<sup>th</sup>, enjoying sweets and other treats.

### From the Parish Nurse and Health Ministry


In need of having your blood pressure checked?

### Diocese of Fall River Preparation for Adult Confirmation

The Adult Confirmation Preparation Program is intended to provide catechetical instruction in the faith, as well as spiritual support to compliment and support the parish in the formation of candidates, who are completing their initiation in the Catholic Church. Adult Catholics (ages 18 and older) who have been baptized, received First Eucharist, and are practicing their faith but have not celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation are invited to participate in the diocesan preparation program.

Interested adults must inform their pastor or a member of the parish staff in their home parish that they wish to prepare for the sacrament. Their pastor and/or parish staff member will advise them of the process for this preparation and what is required of them as a Confirmation candidate. Registration for the Spring 2021 Adult Confirmation program is done through one's parish. There is a \$45 registration fee to cover the cost of materials.

The preparation program involves six class sessions and a retreat day. For the Spring 2021 program, class sessions will be conducted online. These sessions will take place on consecutive Thursday evenings, from 6:30 to 8 p.m., beginning February 18 and concluding on April 22. The retreat is scheduled for Saturday, May 15, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m., at a location to be announced.



### **READING 1 Dt 18:15-20**

Moses spoke to all the people, saying:

“A prophet like me will the LORD, your God, raise up for you from among your own kin; to him you shall listen. This is exactly what you requested of the LORD, your God, at Horeb on the day of the assembly, when you said, ‘Let us not again hear the voice of the LORD, our God, nor see this great fire any more, lest we die.’ And the LORD said to me, ‘This was well said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it. But if a prophet presumes to speak in my name an oracle that I have not commanded him to speak, or speaks in the name of other gods, he shall die.’”

### **READING 2 1 Cor 7:32-35**

Brothers and sisters:

I should like you to be free of anxieties. An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided. An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband. I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

### **GOSPEL Mk 1:14-20**

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, “What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!” Jesus rebuked him and said, “Quiet! Come out of him!” The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, “What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him.” His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

### **THE NICENE CREED**

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.


### **HOLY CROSS PARISH PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS**



## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Most of us are quiet people who desire to live a good and holy life, promote the values and mission of the Gospel as best we can and desire to one day inherit the surprise of life eternal God promises to us. We are not trail blazers. We are simple people who want to do the simple things of life well. But there are others who left a more profound impact along the way of the paths they walked. Folks like Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King, Thomas Merton, Gandhi, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and many others left lasting impacts and legacies. Like Moses, they show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose driven life look like. They show us how to be holy. We need Moses people like these to give us inspiration, hope and an example of holy living.

We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soul-ness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed.


