Bulletin Message 1/19-20

“...assuming that you have heard of him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus, that you should put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted through deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new self, created in God’s way in righteousness and holiness of truth.” (Ephesians 4:21-24)

I like snow, maybe not so much as when I was young and maybe not so much when it’s April and the flakes continue to fall, but generally I like snow. In addition to making winter more usable (it makes snowshoeing, skiing or snowmobile riding possible), it’s beautiful. It covers imperfections, brightens the landscape, especially when the sun shines upon it, and cleans up everything. The problem is that when things melt there’s an awful mess underneath that is revealed, i.e. mud season. Martin Luther, the former Catholic priest that decided to break with the Church, has been purported to have said that the grace of God is like snow covering a dunghill. In other words God’s grace through Christ covers us, but underneath we are still corrupt, nothing changes on the inside, we are still a spiritual mess. This is not the Catholic understanding of the human person who is in relationship with Christ. The grace of God works inwardly. We are renewed from within and this should be reflective in the manner in which we act especially toward others. A caterpillar within its chrysalis is a more apt representation of the spiritual life of the Christian. Hidden in the cocoon the soon to be butterfly begins its metamorphosis, but it’s a brutal process. The cells of muscles and other parts are actually digested, broken down and used to construct the butterfly that will soon emerge. This breaking down to build up again is a perfect analogy of the Christian life. We must suffer trials and difficulties that will break down our pride and resistance to serving God. It’s called overcoming the sinful structures that have been built up in us over the years. Far from an outward display of God’s grace we are actually changed and morph into a totally new person from within. Our intellect becomes rooted in Catholic truth; our heart desires a relationship with God and we begin to see to the needs of others, turning away from the self and overcoming our selfish desires. God told the prophet Nathan when he was to anoint the next king of Israel not to look at the outward appearance of a person because God looks at the heart (I Samuel 16:7). So for God it’s the inside that must change and be renewed and He does so through the Church He founded. Christ, in the Holy Spirit imparts the grace necessary for this inward change through the Sacraments and the Truth, personified in Jesus.

‘Look me in the eye’

“The lamp of the body is the eye. If your eye is sound, your whole body will be filled with light.” — Mt 6:22

My mother was a great observer when it came to solving which child was naughty. She would say, “Look me in the eye and tell me what happened.” I could never get away with anything, even as an adult. I also learned that it was easier to tell the truth than to attempt to perpetuate a lie.

I find looking into the eyes of children easier than looking into the eyes of strangers; perhaps because there is a fear of what the other person might discover about me as they look back.

In the eyes of children, there is an innocence and trust, until it is broken or taken. Our faith teaches us to have a moral compass, a moral conscience, where we do good and avoid evil: “The education of the conscience is a lifelong task,” notes the Catechism of the Catholic Church. “From the earliest years, it awakens the child to the knowledge and practice of the interior law.”

As parents — and a faith community invested in teaching our children — we

might try to rely on our own experiences to guide us when fostering both justice and mercy in our children. We might attempt to share stories of our youth, when we were hurt by friends, picked on for what we wore or could not afford. We might have been the ones to do the hurting, choosing to fit in with the popular or cool kids, as the temptation to do evil was wrapped up in a well disguised package. We may continue to find these same temptations, disguised differently to lure us into keeping up with our neighbors or trying to help

our children by being their “friends” and not following up on the ground rules we set to guide them. Our children witness our actions and model what they see. What exactly are we doing to set the example?

Our children experience far greater temptations and dangers than ever before that can prey upon them at school,

at home, at soccer or dance. The battle is real. It began with Adam and Eve and continues today. Our faith, the truth of God’s love, is our saving grace.

“Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a

child will not enter it.” — Mk 10:15

Take the time to look into the eyes of your children every day. Talk about the day and listen. What is God trying to tell you at this moment in this conversation?

Choose a time to sit together and look at each other, maybe over a meal. Our children deserve our time, love and closeness. Turn off all distracting media. We all deserve this focused attention, this relationship with one another as God is present during these times too.

Practice forgiveness and how to reconcile with one another. Model the behavior you hope to instill in your children. It is not always easy, and you can always turn to God for guidance to help you find the words to say, “Please forgive me for _____. I was wrong. Will you forgive me?” This carries more weight than just saying, “I’m sorry.”

We are called to be in communion that begins at home. Parents are the first teachers of their children. God, our Father, desires this for us, His children. We can support one another, beginning at home, and bring this into the larger community. Together we can make a difference for both our children and one another as we grow in our faith.
