


I must begin the column this week with an admission of an omission. Last week, I said at the outset that I was lacking news. If I had kept up with my diocesan

emails, I would have known that the Bishop was to begin a novena to St. Joseph on Wednesday the 10<sup>th</sup> in preparation of his consecration of the Diocese to St. Joseph. I know there are only four days left, but if you would like to join the novena which is prayed every evening at 7 p.m., you can access it through the diocesan website ([www.bridgeportdiocese.org](http://www.bridgeportdiocese.org)). On Friday, March 19<sup>th</sup>, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Bishop Caggiano will celebrate Mass at the cathedral at 7 p.m. at which time he will consecrate the people of our diocese to the protection and intercession of St. Joseph.

So, why this special attention to St. Joseph this year? This year marks the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the universal church. Pope Francis proclaimed this year to be the “Year of Saint Joseph” in his Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde* (With a Father’s Heart) which he issued in December. It was Pope Pius IX who, in 1870, declared St. Joseph to be Patron of the Universal Church. In 1989, Pope Saint John Paul II named him Guardian of the Redeemer. Pope Benedict XVI ordered that St. Joseph’s name be inserted into the three Eucharistic Prayers ( II, III, IV) where it did not appear after the Blessed Virgin Mary. His name already appeared in the “Roman Canon,” that is to say, the First Eucharistic Prayer.

The earliest appearance in the West of a feast for St. Joseph on the 19<sup>th</sup> of March is in the beginning of the 9<sup>th</sup> century on a French calendar. Evidence from a Coptic calendar indicates that a feast began in the East as early as the 5<sup>th</sup> century but on a different date. It took until the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> centuries for the feast day to become widespread. One source that I have states that the first Mass in honor of St. Joseph celebrated in Rome took place in 1505. In 1621, Pope Gregory XV made the feast a holy day of obligation. I do not know how long that designation lasted.

In *Patris Corde*, Pope Francis says that he wants to share some personal reflections on “this extraordinary figure so close to our own human experience.” He continues, saying, that his desire to do so increased during the pandemic when we all experienced how our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. The pope cites nurses, doctors, storekeepers, supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers. In sum, everyone working to provide essential services and public safety, parents and grandparents, and teachers showing children how to accept and deal with a crisis by adjusting their routines. Pope Francis recognizes the many people who are praying, making sacrifices and interceding for the good of all. The Holy Father writes, “Each of us can discover in Joseph—the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence—an intercessor, a support and guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation.”

## FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The Pope then reflects on seven aspects of St. Joseph's fatherhood-- a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father, a creatively courageous father, a working father, and a father in the shadows. On Friday, I will have copies of the Litany of St. Joseph available at church, and I am asking the priests to lead the congregation in the litany after Communion. The schoolchildren will do the same at their Mass.

#### What have St. Peter School students been up to?





**Help Stop State Sponsored Suicide**

Politicians in Hartford are again considering assisted suicide legislation. The Public Health Committee of the Connecticut General Assembly is considering legalizing a form of suicide in our state commonly referred to as "aid-in-dying" or "physician-assisted suicide". The Committee has raised *House Bill 6425 "An Act Concerning Aid in Dying for Terminally Ill Patients"*.

Modern hospice care and the proper use of pain medications render suicide unnecessary, and we need to be mindful of the threat that a suicide mentality poses to vulnerable people and to people with disabilities

Many people believe that a physician is deeply involved in this process. This not true. The physician orders the mixture of medications, the patient must then consume the deadly cocktail of drugs without assistance. Many times without even a physician or nurse present.

**We should never allow legislators to establish suicide as a solution to medical issues.** Don't let the state persuade us that it's dignified for an ill person to sign their own execution order. Don't let the state create an environment where ill people will feel they have a "responsibility to die".

Catholic teaching condemns physician-assisted suicide because it, like murder, involves taking an innocent human life:

*Suicide is always as morally objectionable as murder. The Church's tradition has always rejected it as a gravely evil choice: To concur with the intention of another person to commit suicide and to help in carrying it out through so-called "assisted suicide" means to cooperate in, and at times to be the actual perpetrator of, an injustice which can never be excused, even if it is requested. Saint Augustine writes that "it is never licit to kill another: even if he should wish it." True "compassion" leads to sharing another's pain; it does not kill the person whose suffering we cannot bear. (John Paul II, The Gospel of Life, no. 66).*
