Pastor's Desk News is light this weekend. It always is during the *dead* of winter.

Not being a big tech person, I don't engage much in it. However, we all came to recognize the value of zoom meetings during the epidemic. We announced a few weeks ago that our Sunday Religious Education would go to zoom rather than in person classes for the month of January out of concern about the transmission of the virus to the children. We regret that on the last two Sundays we could not operate the virtual meetings successfully. Barbara and I apologize to our families who experienced the frustration of not being able to link up with their class at all or who were dropped. There was plenty of frustration on this end as well, as you can imagine. Despite efforts of some very capable minds for which we give thanks, kinks in the system were not worked out by early in the week. So, Barbara and I made the decision to return to in-person class rather than risk not being ready for prime time today. All classes are back in session in the school.

Jennifer Emminger, the Deputy Planning Director for the City, sent us an email and flyer regarding virtual public workshop for an affordable housing plan the city is working on. The workshop is tomorrow (Monday) evening from 6 to 8 p.m. Affordable housing is an important topic for all cities and towns, and the City is inviting residents to share their thoughts and comments which will guide the development of policies. There is also a survey that can be accessed. Jennifer sent along a flyer with the links to both the workshop and the survey which we have made available to you in the vestibule.

Our diocese received covid testing kits to be distributed to parishes with the aim of getting kits into the hands of people who need them. Deacon Patrick Toole has written to me offering us 300. I responded with my interest in taking them. If I can work out a pick-up before the weekend, they will be available to you at Mass; otherwise, I will have them at the rectory next week.

Next Sunday is the kick-off for the annual Catholic Schools Week, a week to celebrate and promote Catholic schools for what they are and offer to families, the community of the church, and to the greater society. Of course, because we are Catholics, the celebration also acts as an occasion to raise money for our schools which always face economic challenges. Education costs a great deal of money, and tuition can only go so high before it is out of the reach of families. We have a second collection next week for the support of Saint Peter School now in its 136<sup>th</sup> year. Kindly think about lending a hand in our school's mission to educate the entire child—mind, heart, and spirit. In the weekly offertory report, we have included the Christmas collection. We neglected to give it to you, and I forgot about it until a parishioner said to me last week that she had not seen it. We waited a couple of weeks for all the envelopes to arrive in the mail, and then forgot to place the total in the bulletin. I thank all of you for making generous gifts to the parish, and I thank the parishioners who are paying attention to our income!

# COMUNIDAD HISPANA SAN PEDRO

La Iglesia católica celebra la "Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos" del 18 al 25 de enero

La Iglesia católica, junto con muchas otras Iglesias cristianas en todo el mundo, celebra la "Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos" del 18 al 25 de enero.

El evento lleva por lema: "Nosotros hemos visto aparecer su estrella en el Oriente y venimos a adorarlo" (cfr. Mt 2, 2).

Se trata de una cita del Evangelio de San San Mateo que recuerda la travesía de los Reyes Magos para venir a adorar al niño Jesús.

En esta semana todos los fieles están invitados a rezar por la unidad de todos los cristianos, que son convocados a compartir sus oraciones con otros y apoyar además las iniciativas ecuménicas.

Asimismo, el cardenal Mario Grech y el cardenal Kurt Koch invitan a todos los cristianos a orar por la unidad y a seguir caminando juntos.

En una carta conjunta enviada el 28 de octubre de 2021 a todos los obispos responsables del ecumenismo, el cardenal Koch, presidente del Pontificio Consejo para la Promoción de la Unidad de los Cristianos, y el cardenal Grech, secretario general del Sínodo de los Obispos, presentaron sugerencias para implementar la dimensión ecuménica del proceso sinodal en las iglesias locales.

"De hecho, tanto la sinodalidad como el ecumenismo son procesos que nos invitan a caminar juntos", escribieron los dos cardenales.

Camino sinodal y ecuménico

La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos 2022, preparada por el Consejo de Iglesias de Próximo Oriente ofrece una buena oportunidad para orar con todos los cristianos para que el Sínodo se desarrolle en un espíritu ecuménico.

Al reflexionar sobre el tema, los dos cardenales afirman:

"Como los Reyes Magos, también los cristianos caminan juntos (synodos) guiados por la misma luz celestial y enfrentándose a las mismas tinieblas del mundo.

También ellos están llamados a adorar juntos a Jesús y a abrir sus tesoros.

Conscientes de nuestra necesidad de ser acompañados por nuestros hermanos y hermanas en Cristo y de sus muchos dones, les pedimos que caminen con nosotros durante estos dos años y rogamos sinceramente que Cristo nos lleve más cerca de El y que así nos acerquemos unos a otros."
