



Celebrate our Nations heritage this February during African American History Month! This Fourth Sunday Winter Ordinary Time is not too ordinary for us New England Patriots fans! Contrary to what many say, no it's not just routine for us to make it to a super bowl & we don't yet know the outcome. What we do know is here at Saint Joseph's our food pantry drive requests SOUPER Bowl - bring those soup donations to support others these cold weeks and months. More than \$5 million for 30 seconds of advertisement; in 2017 \$277 million spent on potato chips; \$1.2 Billion on beer; 2019 projected that 1.35 billion chicken wings will be consumed! If 1.35 billion wings were laid end to end along interstate 95, they would stretch from Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia to Gilette Stadium in Foxboro! (But let's forget about Philadelphia! LII!)

Imagine social justice, Christian random acts of kindness and strategic planning to assist the needy having the energy, engagement and millions and billions of dollars that Super Bowl Sunday experiences. Imagine the mission of Jesus with a SuperGospel Sunday. Living life filled with the spirit of of gospel love is the field goal of every Catholic Christian.

Our recent past & the success of Boston sports teams have transformed us & leave us with expectations. Expectations have a habit of tripping us up. We think we have it all wrapped up! We know what to expect. But then something happens to surprise us; is this for real? The folks of Nazareth had expectations. This "Son of Joseph & Mary" couldn't possibly be the anointed one, Could he? God has a habit of surprising us! The people of Nazareth were expecting a different kind of messiah! Jesus wanted to make sure they knew he was not just sent for his own people. The world is a lot larger than that. Gods' healing power, Gods' love, can not be confined to one town or one people. It's an experience and a message that must be carried to care for all peoples.

Catholic Social Justice and the Gospel message ground us in our liturgical celebrations and faith formation. We are guided by the same Spirit that anointed Jesus to go forth in his mission. Jesus calls us to ongoing discernment, formation and mission.

The book many of us are reading these winter days, "Rebuilt" is an example of transformation at the parish level. Our second reading from Corinthians these weeks of winter ordinary time has called us as individuals into the communal sharing of our spiritual gifts. Today we hear of faith, hope and love and for parish transformation perhaps the greatest of these is flexibility!

Pope Francis has summoned the presidents of every bishops conference around the world to a

Summit Feb 21-24 to discuss clergy sexual abuse and protecting children. This is evidence of the global situation and the reality and scope of hurt and need for our universal church to address these horrors and pain that is ongoing. As one St Joseph parishioner has expressed "churchgoing laity are hanging on by their fingers". Bless you, bless us, one and all who are "hanging on" and desire care, compassion and values (CCV) to be brought to the light which must guide us through the darkness and a specific address and course of action.

Our reading of "Rebuilt" and Lenten discussions are in part meant to assist us locally in wrapping ourselves in a mantle of faith to carry the Gospel message and mission of Jesus. Let us use our individual spiritual gifts so as to collectively live and announce the social justice of Jesus Christ. Let us act our way into a new way of thinking. Jesus' actions show us the way. Jesus' words guide us to the light of day from any and all nights of darkness. Feb 21-24, in fact everyday, we pray Thy Will Be Done. When our will and God's will align, healing and harmony, hope and grace abound.
