

Celebrate our Nations heritage this February during African American History Month!

February 2, 2020, Miami? There's still confetti on Cambridge Street from our Super Bowl champions parade and already we are on to what's next. Carpe Diem, savor the moment, vaci piano, rarely do we actually take the time to smell the roses. Yes, here in patriots nation we really deserve to bask in the success of it all! As human beings, blessed with all creation we really do best when rhythm and time are not at light speed!

2020 is on the horizon. Super Bowl contenders and many other potentials remain to be seen! It was made mention recently here in this very bulletin blurb that 2020 is perfect vision. St Joseph's is journeying through 2019 with a task to focus our vision (perhaps not perfect) of social justice and care and compassion. Like Peter in today's Gospel we have been hard at it for some time. Jesus asks us to put out again, into the deep. Like Peter, our going out at Jesus' urging is an act of considerable faith. And as today's Gospel recounts, Peter's faith is rewarded abundantly. Jesus assures that he has not come to drive sinners and the lost away but to bring them back, to "catch" them in the "net" of God's love.

Certainly one thing our reading of the book "Rebuilt" is hammering home is that our fundamental social justice work of mercy is to be a welcoming people to those who have been away. To seek out the lost and "dechurched". These are challenging and difficult days, not easy to give energy and time to a vision of 2020. We await the results of the Pope's meeting with universal church leadership in just two weeks. We desire to be of truth and justice and hope and healing. We are wounded healers and in an effort to reach out with hope and healing we must ourselves be healed. Recovery and health are the foundation of any vision for tomorrow. Today we must admit, and acknowledge our powerlessness and that it is in part the misconception of power which has made some things unmanageable. We can be restored, we can have vision.

February 11, feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, is world day for the sick. We pray for all in need of recovery of mind, body and/or spirit. We pray for all afflicted with disease and all affected by another's afflictions. At all the masses we pray with and for all of us who are ill, we celebrate the sacrament of the sick and through the holy anointing call on the Holy Spirit to seal and strengthen with forgiveness and healing.

Spiritual maladies require spiritual remedies. We must have vision. There are times, there are situations in life when a spiritual experience is absolutely necessary but sometimes the price (not financial) is too high, too much upon the basis suggested. At some roundabouts in life we realize that while we possess a great deal of information, we actually know very little! God will constantly disclose-reveal more to us! We truly are called to ask God what we can do each day for those whom we encounter. The answers will come. Trusting in God we are together in the Fellowship of the Spirit as we trudge the Road of Happy Destiny.

There is a vision for us. As we seize the day (Carpe Diem) we must have a concept of time (Tempus fugit) and acknowledge and design planning and timelines. Presently hope and healing are our abandonment of the Spirit. Please God guide our Pope and universal shepherds with the gifts and the fruits of the Spirit. Guide us here in our local church of Saint Joseph and bring us into focus and more perfect vision as we go out deeper, casting and catching.


