THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

From the
Pastor's Desk



My Dearest Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I said last weekend at the homily time that I would print in my letter the e-mail from Msgr. Joseph LaMorte, the Vicar General and Chancellor, writing on behalf of Cardinal Dolan: "MSGR. WILLIAMS FOUND NOT GUILTY OF ABUSE: A Vatican authorized tribunal, after a canonical trial into an allegation that Msgr. Williams sexually abused one minor ruled that Msgr. William Williams is NOT guilty of the charge. Unconnectedly, Msgr. Williams' health is taking a downturn. Please remember him in your prayers and pray also for those who have experienced the effects of the current misfortune in the Church-survivors, their families, priests, and deacons." May we thank God and the Blessed Mother that his good name has been cleared and he can be at peace for the rest of his life.

I also said that I would write a summary of the items occurring after July 1st:

1) Each of the five worship sites and four parishes of Phoenicia, Woodstock-West Hurley, Centerville, and Saugerties/Glasco would REMAIN AS FULLY FUNCTIONING PARISHES. However, each of the five worship sites (Glasco, Saugerties, Centerville, West Hurley-Woodstock, and Phoenicia) will be having only 2 Holy Masses on the weekends (Sunday Masses). In Centerville, the Saturday afternoon Holy Mass will be 5:30 P.M. (Not 5 P.M.) and the only Sunday morning Holy Mass will be 8:00 A.M. (Not 8:30 A.M. and the 10:30 A.M. is eliminated).

2) The only weekday Holy Masses are going to be on Tuesday and Thursday at 9:00 A.M. (Not 8:30 A.M.) There will probably be Holy Communion Services on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday at a convenient time (probably 8:30 A.M.)

3) THERE WILL BE NO RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AT CENTERVILLE ANY MORE. There will be the option of going to Woodstock or Saugerties for Religious Ed. Any of our catechists are most welcome at either religious education programs to teach a class during next year and beyond. New forms are available at the entrances of the Church starting this weekend.

4) Between now and June 30th inclusive, none of the four parishes are taking Holy Mass intentions. Starting July 1st, all

Holy Mass intentions, Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals will be worked out through Saugerties (St. Mary of the Snow). You may either want your money returned, or the intention transferred to another worship site, or have a future open date at Centerville.

5) There will be one bulletin for the four parishes printed out of Woodstock.

ALL OF THESE THINGS TAKE EFFECT ON JULY 1st. ALSO, THESE ITEMS WERE FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE WITH THE CARDINAL'S APPROVAL. Please don't panic; things will be worked out during July and August. Also, please don't spread rumors; all information will be said during the Holy Masses and from the bulletins. I thank you for your patience and understanding.

On a happier note, I will renew the vows of some 50th Holy Matrimonial Anniversary couples at the 10:30 A.M. Holy Mass this Sunday, June 16th. They are wonderful examples of giving the graces of the Sacrament of Marriage to one another for a lifetime.

All-Day Adoration will be this Sunday from the end of the 10:30 A.M. Holy Mass until 8:30 A.M. Benediction.

The Spanish language Holy Mass will be at the usual time at St. Mary's Chapel.

The Corpus Christi Procession will be next Sunday after the 10:30 A.M. Holy Mass on June 23rd.

FINALLY, I WANT TO THANK ANYONE AND EVERYONE INVOLVED WITH LAST SUNDAY'S POT LUCK LUNCHEON AS THE FAREWELL TO YOURS TRULY AND THANK YOU FOR EITHER BEING THERE OR BEING THERE IN SPIRIT; IT WAS WONDERFULLY MEMORABLE. I want to thank you for your gifts to me.

May we pray that God will take care of the 4 Parishes and 5 Worship Sites. God bless you.

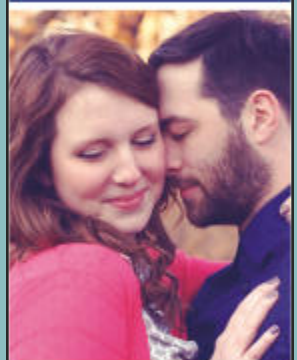
