



We present the oils consecrated and blessed by Bishop Scharfenberger at the Chrism Mass.

Oil of the Sick ('Oleum Infirmorum') is used to offer comfort and strength to those who are ill.


Oil of the Catechumen ('Oleum Catechumenorum' or 'Oleum Sanctum') is used in the rite of baptism.

Sacred Chrism ('Sanctum Chrisma' or 'Oil of Gladness') olive oil mixed with a small amount of balm or balsam, is used in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination to the Priesthood and the Dedication of Altars and Churches.


