SAINT OF THE WEEK: <u>St. Anthony</u> *'from* the Sayings of Abba Anthony'



1. When the holy Abba Anthony lived in the desert he was beset by accidie, and attacked by many sinful thoughts. He said to God, 'Lord, I want to be saved but these thoughts do not leave me alone; what shall I do in my affliction? How can I be saved?' A short while afterwards, when he got up to go out, Anthony saw a man like

himself sitting at his work, getting up from his work to pray, then sitting down and plaiting a rope, then getting up again to pray. It was an angel of the Lord sent to correct and reassure him. He heard the angel saying to him, 'Do this and you will be saved.' At these words, Anthony was filled with joy and courage. He did this, and he was saved.

- 2. When the same Abba Anthony thought about the depth of the judgements of God, he asked, 'Lord, how is it that some die when they are young, while others drag on to extreme old age? Why are there those who are poor and those who are rich? Why do wicked men prosper and why are the just in need?' He heard a voice answering him, 'Anthony, keep your attention on yourself; these things are according to the judgement of God, and it is not to your advantage to know anything about them.'
- 3. Someone asked Abba Anthony, 'What must one do in order to please God?' The old man replied, 'Pay attention to what I tell you: whoever you may be, always have God before your eyes; whatever you do, do it according to the testimony of the holy Scriptures; in whatever place you live, do not easily leave it. Keep these three precepts and you will be saved.'

Dear Friends,

Remember the Year of the Eucharist; and in that connection, I have a couple of items for you this week.

First, an advertisement of sorts. At 7PM on Thursday, 20 January, our Knights of Columbus council has organized a Holy Hour. As with all Holy Hours, this will be a time of solemn worship of the Most Blessed Sacrament. It entails time for silent personal prayer as well as verbal formal prayer. A Holy Hour needs no real justification; any time with Our Lord is well spent. But this Holy Hour has in mind the praying for reparation and healing in view of abortion. (The SCOTUS decision of Roe vs. Wade was issued on 24 January, 1973.) Beyond that, the Holy Eucharist was instituted on a Thursday evening, and our Holy Hour will take place on a Thursday evening. We remember this and are grateful. Therefore, I strongly encourage all to attend who can.

Second, a bit of what we might call Eucharistic housekeeping. I would ask everyone—and I remind myself to take extra care when receiving Holy Communion at Mass. Over the past couple of months, there have been an unusual number of sacred hosts that have fallen to the ground during Mass. Obviously no one ever does this intentionally, and this remark is not to single anyone out, to be sure. But most of these accidents are caused by a number of things. This time of year, our hands are dry and the hosts can become difficult to handle. Sometimes communicants struggle with removing the mask. Sometimes it is simply a matter of rushing or inadvertence.

Whatever the case, as I say, I would simply ask us all to be extra cautious. And I add this one thought. Receiving Holy Communion on the tongue often reduces the risk of dropping the sacred host. The reason for this is obvious: it is easier, and simply removes extra movement. Assuredly, there is nothing strange or especially unsanitary about this way of receiving—in fact, it is the ordinary way to receive Communion in the Roman Rite (but stay tuned: more on that some other time!)

In the meantime, whatever your practice, I'm grateful for your attention. As I am always saying, even our smallest observances have an important part to play in our devotion. And to receive Holy Communion is, without exaggeration, the most important moment of our day or week. Perfectly obvious, then, that we show great care and devotion. So the Year of the Eucharist will serve to remind us of this, and more. God love you!
