





FAITH FORMATION NOTES

Read the Gospel: **Matthew 2:1-12**

The Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, asking the whereabouts of the newborn king of the Jews. Herod was troubled by this news of the birth, as was all of Jerusalem. He sent the Magi to Bethlehem to search for the child, asking that they bring the child to him so that he could do the child homage. The Magi set out and followed the star to the place where the child was. They did the child homage and offered him their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, and they left for their country by a different route.

This Gospel narrative is full of adventure, danger, mystery, and yes—gifts! During this Christmas season, enjoy dramatizing this Gospel as a family. Then think about how far you would travel, how far you would go to pay homage to Jesus. Would you go as far as your parish to receive the Sacraments or to spend some time in quiet prayer? Would you go as far as the soup kitchen to serve a meal to the hungry? Would you go as far as to tell someone to stop bullying a classmate or a coworker? Would you go as far as to give up a morning cup of coffee or a favorite treat in order to give to someone in need the gift of food or clothing or the necessities of life? How far would you go? What would you give as your gifts to the King?

The star led the Magi to the place where Jesus was. With your family, cut out several yellow construction paper stars. On each star write either a way you can find Jesus—such as “read God’s Word”—or the name of a person who has helped you find Jesus, such as “Grandma Joan.” Create a mobile of your stars using coat hangers and yarn or string. Hang your stars in a place where all family members will see them.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Hurray! It’s 2021—good riddance 2020! We are still celebrating the wonder of the Incarnation—God’s only son, Jesus, born of Mary and now, especially this week, being revealed to the world. We celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany—a Greek word meaning ‘revealed’. It is a very popular Feast celebrated in Europe and often called “Little Christmas”. This is underscored by the visit of the Magi—the kings or wise men who followed the star and arrived in Bethlehem to adore the Christ child. As told in Matthew’s Gospel, this is a very important moment in Jesus’ life, and, to be sure, the Magi who came and worshiped. You see, they are symbolic of those who are from ‘other lands’ - they represent the rest of the world in that they are not Jewish and travelled from the East—each from different places. While their names and lands from where they came are not in Matthew’s Gospel, legend and tradition hold that they were named Gaspar, king of India, Melchior, king of Persia and Balthasar, king of Arabia. Since the Gospel mentions three gifts—gold, frankincense and myrrh, that is where the number of three kings/magi is derived from. The gifts each hold a spiritual meaning: gold symbolizes Jesus’ kingship on earth, frankincense (*an incense*) is a symbol of Jesus’ deity as the Son of God, and myrrh (*an embalming oil*) symbolizes Jesus’ anointing following his death. Truly very ‘unique’ gifts for sure. One of the questions that I try to think about on this feast day (*by the way, I was Baptized on this feast in 1968 by Bishop Maginn at St. Vincent de Paul church in Albany.*) is what gifts might I and each of us offer to Jesus? Each of us have gifts, and hopefully we will do all we can to put those gifts to use for the benefit of our parish, our loved ones and everyone. Just as Jesus is God’s gift to the world, and Jesus’ life a gift to us, especially as we rejoice that he has been born to redeem us, must we give our gifts. Let us be generous this new year, especially in light of the Coronavirus, etc., and give of our gifts as we emulate the example of the Magi and of Jesus. Merry (little) Christmas!

I wish to offer my deepest appreciation to all in our parish who have helped out, pitched in, lent a hand and been so kind in so many ways. The staff are truly heroic in all that they do, often unnoticed, but still very much appreciated. All of our liturgical ministers who give of their time to help out with Masses. Thanks also to all who have been so extraordinarily generous with your financial gifts that help us to maintain our annual budget and be able to pay bills and payroll. I thank one and all from the bottom of my heart!

Let us all pray that 2021 will prove to be a very good year, filled with the hope of defeating the dreaded Covid virus and no longer having to live in a state of worry and fear. Happy New Year!

YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH: Did you know that



Pope Francis recently proclaimed a special “Year of St. Joseph” for the entire Church. This holy year observance will permit the Faithful to take time to reflect on the life of the foster father of Jesus. This special observance began on December 8, 2020, the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX’s Declaration of St. Joseph as the patron of the Universal Church, and concludes on March 19, 2021. Pope Francis stated that “all the Faithful will thus have the opportunity to commit themselves, with prayers and good works, to obtain the help of St. Joseph, head of the family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from serious human and social tribulations that today grip the contemporary world.”


