



FAITH FORMATION NOTES

Read the Gospel: **Mark 1:7-11**

Most of Mark's accounts of the events in Jesus' life are short and to the point. The account of Jesus' Baptism given in today's Gospel illustrates this. In a few brief sentences Mark tells of the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River by John the Baptist. The brevity of the final verse of the passage makes it unclear whether Jesus alone heard the voice that came from the heavens, or if everyone who witnessed his Baptism heard the same. What is clear from the words is the special relationship Jesus had with God the Father.

The final words of today's Gospel are wonderful words for us to bestow upon our children. Who is not encouraged by the reminder that they are a beloved son or daughter? What child, at any age, does not long to hear from a parent, "With you I am well pleased?" Today is a good day to think about how often you take the time to lavish words of love and praise upon your child. Take time to be still and let your heavenly Father lavish those same words of love and praise upon you.

Set out pictures, candles, white garments, and other reminders of the Baptisms of family members. Recall the celebrations. Remind your family that the promises made at Baptism include: being taught to practice our faith, keeping God's Commandments, and loving God and neighbor. Talk about how family members are living out these baptismal promises today.

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend, the Church observes the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This celebration concludes the Christmas season for another year. When we hear the account of this wondrous event, which marks the start of Jesus' public ministry, it reminds us that even Jesus was baptized. Jesus goes out to the Jordan River and there, by his cousin, John the Baptist, he commences his ministry, the purpose for which he was born: to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven and the Gospel—that is—his life—and to redeem us through his Passion. The main purpose of baptism in Jesus' time was not a means of initiation, which is what the Sacrament of Baptism does for us, but was a ritual of being purified of sin in order to be able to take part in temple activities, among other things. We are also told that as Jesus came up out of the water, there is heard the voice of God saying that Jesus is God's beloved Son and to listen to him. This is key to our role as Christians, but, we don't always do so. Maybe we can try to do better in this area! Following this, Jesus goes about calling his Apostles and proclaiming the Kingdom. If we take our own Baptisms seriously, then we must do like Jesus and help to proclaim the Kingdom in words and deeds that reflect our love of God as well as our love of others—easier said than done! I invite you to make a resolution as this new year begins to more actively live our Faith by how we pray, worship, love, forgive, and more!

A word about Mass intentions. You may notice in the bulletin that at certain Masses, there is no intention listed. This does not mean that Mass is cancelled, but simply that no intention was requested for a specific date or time. Having a Mass celebrated is a wonderful gift. If you would like to schedule a Mass intention for the repose of the soul of loved ones who have died, or, to honor someone living, such as for a birthday or other special milestone, please call the rectory and we will gladly schedule Mass intentions.

After all the Masses this weekend, you are welcome to take the Poinsettias that we purchased for Christmas. The plants will be on tables in the Gathering Space. Consider bringing a plant to neighbors, shut-ins or nursing homes (if they will permit it). Thanks to all who donated funds for the Poinsettias; a list will be in next week's bulletin of all flower memorials. Please do not take the clear water dishes as we reuse them.

As you will see in this bulletin, the offertory summary for the past few weeks is proof positive of the truly remarkable generosity that so many in our parish has demonstrated over the Christmas season despite the dreadful virus pandemic. I wish to express my heartfelt appreciation to all who have been so generous sharing your financial blessings! I pray that God will reward you abundantly!

OUR CLOTHING SHED REOPENS! Good



news! The clothing donation shed at St. Michael's, which was temporarily closed due to global effects of the Coronavirus pandemic, will be re-opened soon! If you're not familiar with the clothing donation shed, it's designed to give community members a uniquely clean, convenient,

and well-cared-for option to donate their used clothing, shoes, blankets, sheets, towels, and other textiles to. St. Pauly Textile Inc. who has provided the shed and that partners with businesses and various organizations to distribute donated items in the U.S. and worldwide, where they're ultimately given to people who need them. St. Michael's receives funding for donated clothing, and additionally has the option to use donations to serve community needs. With over 1,300 clothing drop-off sheds in place, St. Pauly Textile Inc. collects more than 90,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries (including the U.S.) yearly. In 2019, the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills, which clothed an estimated 2.5 million people worldwide. The company was founded in 1996 and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Please note: the items we accept are clothing, shoes, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, curtains, pillowcases, and stuffed animals. Please do NOT leave other household items outside of the shed or inside the shed. Such items will be discarded in the dumpster.
