FAITH FORMATION NOTES:

Mark's account of the Passion is the shortest of the Gospel accounts and is known for its swift impact and drama. It begins with an unnamed woman pouring costly perfumed oil on Jesus' head and includes accounts of the Last Supper, Jesus and his disciples praying in Gethsemane, Jesus' arrest, his trial, Crucifixion, Death, and burial.

The Gospel story told today further unfolds in the liturgies of Holy Thursday evening and Good Friday. The Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday) is the Church's annual retreat time. It is a time to tell the story of the Paschal Mystery—the suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The story is told through lavish use of song, Scripture, symbol, Sacrament, and procession. This is the holiest time of the entire Church year. How will your family spend these holiest of days? As Holy Week begins, make room on the family calendar for quiet and prayer together, and make time to attend the liturgies of the Triduum.

If you are unable to attend your parish's celebration of the Triduum, gather your family and read aloud the appropriate portions of today's Gospel on Holy Thursday evening and on Good Friday. Sing a simple refrain or hymn such as "Jesus, Remember Me" and spend a few moments together in silent prayer.

DISCUSSION STARTERS:

1. On Holy Thursday: On this night, Jesus gathered together his closest friends—his disciples—to share a special meal. If you were holding a special meal tonight, what friends would you invite and why? What foods would you serve? What would you talk about?

2. On Good Friday: On this day, Jesus suffered and died on the Cross out of love for us. What does it mean to you that he did this? Who are those suffering in the world, in your workplace, in your classroom, and in your family today? How can you ease their suffering?

3. On Holy Saturday: Jesus is in the tomb. His friends are trying to make sense of what has happened. They cannot see the coming of the Resurrection. Today is a day for waiting and for praying. For what are you waiting? For what do you wish to pray?

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:

Please keep in your prayers Marissa LaPointe who will be Baptized, Confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time at the Easter Vigil. Also, Jim Wheaton will be received into the Church through his profession of Faith. They, and all those completing the R.C.I.A are great witnesses to us all how important and meaningful the Faith is and how we can be (re) energized too as we live our Faith.

For information about the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.), please contact Mary Stearns. R.C.I.A. is the process by which an adult (age 18+) becomes a full member of the Catholic Church. It is intended for both those who have never been Baptized and for those who were Baptized in a religious tradition other than Roman Catholicism.



Dear Friends in Christ,

As anyone who has ever been in a race knows, the runners don't begin until the starter shouts, "*on your marks...get set...go....*" Well, this is what this Sunday is meant to do for us, as we are about to start Holy Week. As we begin the most sacred time of the Church year, we are in the starting blocks so to speak. Now is when, as our Lenten journey concludes, we come to the penultimate moment of preparation for Jesus' Paschal Mystery—his suffering, death and resurrection—and celebrate the Triduum liturgies so that we may rejoice Easter morning. I have found this Lent to be rather challenging in a few ways. There have been numerous 'distractions' which have blurred my perspective of the benefits of better prayer, meaningful fasting and generous alms giving. Perhaps some of you feel the same way. I am most eager to dive into these last days before Easter to better deepen my relationship with the Lord. Please do so too, especially by attending the beautiful liturgies of Holy Week. Unlike last year, when we were in lock down due to the pandemic and had to observe Holy Week and Easter sequestered in our homes, this year holds even more meaning as we are able to gather together, at least some of us, and embrace the great gift that Jesus' passion offers to us all. I hope that you will be able to join in the liturgies this year.

Linda Raville and our music ministry and others have done it again! Like they did last Advent with a 'virtual' service of Lessons & Carols, they have created a 'virtual' Tenebrae service, which marks the 'Seven Last Words of Jesus', presented through Scripture and music. It is a great way to prayerfully reflect on Jesus' last moments of life, by which, we have eternal life. I thank all who participated in this, and especially Linda, who has gone above and beyond the call of duty! Please take the time to view this special Tenebrae service!

Finally as you consider your Easter offertory gift for the parish, please be as generous as your means permit. The financial support by so many in our parish the past year has been absolutely remarkable. Words cannot express my appreciation. If you can possibly give a little more this Easter, it will be most appreciated as there were unanticipated repairs in the school that had to be completed among other things! And, if you wish to help with the purchase of Easter plants, your gift for this will be most welcome too! God Bless. *Father Tony Childs*

YOUR EASTER OFFERING:




