





A Word of Special Thanks... I want to offer my appreciation to some folks who have gone above and beyond the call of duty sharing their time and talents to make our parish and buildings better.




Ed Brochu has done several important upgrades or repairs to the outside lights. He installed

the outdoor light posts in front of the main church entrance and replaced the old, worn bollards with new, energy efficient LED lights as well as updating the electrical area for the WIFI camera and related items.

Next, I thank Loretta and Marty Lemmo, Ann and Tom Ryan, Nancy Salazar and Ann Jones who have given the school kitchen a much needed deep cleaning. They also painted the entire kitchen to give it a fresh look. They spent lots of time both scrubbing and washing the kitchen and then painting the walls and cabinets. We will soon be installing new flooring in the kitchen to coordinate with the paint scheme, and to repair several areas where the old vinyl linoleum is damaged or missing.

I also thank Richard Smaldone and his helper, Pat, who we had repair the front walkway to the rectory and the apron of the parish garages, but, they also moved the school roofing stone around the property as was intended for several years, to beautify and enhance the outdoor areas around the rectory and church/school building. FAITH FORMATION NOTES:

Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that he is the Good Shepherd. He makes a distinction between good shepherds and hired hands. Good shepherds truly care for, guard, and protect their sheep. Hired hands are more likely to run at the first sign of trouble. As a good shepherd, Jesus knows his sheep and his sheep know him. Jesus is so devoted to his sheep that he will lay down his life for them.

Think of all the people who share in the task of teaching, guiding, and protecting your child. Who among those people is truly a good shepherd—a person who invests himself or herself in your child's life? Who are the "hired hands"—those who are less personally invested, but are still a part of your child's circle of formation and care? Think about your own role as a parent. How are you being a good shepherd to your child and to your family? Are there any "wolves" in your life, drawing your attention away from the flock God has placed in your care?

Today is a day to give thanks to the shepherds! Invite family members to talk about the good shepherds in their lives and in your family's life. Make a list of the shepherds who are mentioned by name. Use arts and crafts supplies and notecards to write thank-you notes or to create "Good Shepherd certificates." Mail or deliver the notes or certificates in the coming week.

Dear Friends in Christ,

This week, the Gospel is the Good Shepherd. This is only found in John's Gospel and is a unique allegory that communicates his tender love. This passage comes after the dramatic healing of the man born blind, which is read in Lent, and is one of the 'coming to Faith' excerpts. With the image of the Good Shepherd, we are drawn close to the Redeemer in a way that allows us to know we are loved in a special way more than seeing Jesus as distant or unconnected from us. In Jesus' time, the image of a shepherd expresses one who cares for and is found among the flock. In the Gospel, Jesus points out that with him being the Good Shepherd, there are also 'bad' shepherds. Jesus goes to great lengths to point out that he is the one, true, 'Good' shepherd and goes so far as to say that he will even lay down his life for his flock. This calls to mind for us Jesus' Passion and how he gave his life to redeem ours! I hope that we appreciate our Lord, the Good Shepherd who leads us to our Heavenly pasture.

This Sunday is the annual observance of World Day of Prayer for Vocations. When we think about the word 'vocation' it usually conjures the notion of religious vocations, e.g. priesthood, consecrated life and the diaconate. However, there is also the vocation of all of us, by virtue of our Baptism, who are called to live this as best as possible every day. Married couples have a vocation as partners and in mutual love as wife and husband. Single persons have a vocation of living a holy life. And, to be sure, vocations to religious life are equally vital. To that point, our Diocese is blessed this year to be able to ordain five new priests! This is the most that have been ordained in all my years of priesthood, since 2000. However, this is not the norm but is a rare (yet joyful) exception. Point of fact, I was the only priest ordained in 2000! Please continue to pray that the women and men whom God calls to a life of ministry will have the courage and Faith to be open to and prayerfully discern how they may best respond. The same goes for all of us as we seek to better live our vocation as a good Christian! In another part of the Gospels, Jesus even directs us to pray the Lord of the harvest send more workers into the vineyard. May we all live our vocation as followers of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and share the Gospel daily, in word and deed.




