





FAITH FORMATION NOTES:

Read: **John 6:41-51**

The crowds in last week's Gospel had faith in Jesus, and at the same time they doubted him. In today's Gospel, the Jews doubt that Jesus is who he says he is. They know that he is the son of Joseph and Mary, but they cannot explain—and therefore have a hard time believing—that he had come down from heaven.


Like the Jews in today's Gospel, most children and youth have a hard time believing and trusting what they cannot see. For example, they cannot see that a choice that seems easy and fun and good today will bear negative consequences for them in the future. Like Jesus, we must remain consistent and persistent in saying what we know to be true. Our words may be met with doubt and resistance, but they serve to remind our children of the Gospel values and expectations we uphold. Today, take time to think about where you need to stand firm and remain consistent and persistent as a parent.

Have a family meeting during which you discuss expectations. Begin with a simple open-ended statement such as, "I expect my parent(s) to . . ." or "I expect my children to . . ." As ideas are given, make a list for parents and a list for children. Review the lists with the family, then vote on the top five expectations on each list. Create two final lists to post on the family fridge or bulletin board. Let these serve as a reminder and as an invitation to family members to be consistent in honoring your family's values and expectations of one another.

The RCIA process emphasizes personal conversion and commitment to the Catholic way of life. Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope that you are enjoying the nicer weather that we have been blessed with the past few days. I was expecting to a giant Ark float by any day with all the rain we have had. I also hope that you have been enjoying chapter six of John's Gospel which we are reflecting on—the Bread of Life Discourse. It really is a marvelous expression of how the first century Church was coming to more fully understand who Jesus is and what it is that He offers to us as the Bread of Life. We read in The Catechism of the Catholic Church, "§1324 *The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life."*¹³⁶ *"The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch."*¹³⁷ §1325 *"The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit."*¹³⁸ §1326 *Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.*¹³⁹ §1327 *In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: "Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking."*¹". I encourage all to take a few minutes to reflect on this and truly 'feast' on the gift of Jesus' love given in abundance.

This year, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, August 15, is next Sunday. It is one of the few Solemnities which takes precedence over the regular Sunday Mass. We will have our usual weekend Mass schedule for this solemnity. Ave Maria!

I am thrilled to announce that the monthly Mass at the Home of the Good Shepherd will be resuming this month. Mass is celebrated there on the third Wednesday of the month. At this time, other visitors are not able to be admitted due to ongoing Covid-19 protocols. This month's Mass will be this coming Wednesday, August 18 at 2:00 pm.

Finally, continued thanks to all for your very generous financial support. Please try to make up any missed weeks if possible.




COVID-19 UPDATE: As many have seen in the recent news reports, there is a significant increase in Covid-19 cases in our area as well as everywhere else! It is absolutely essential that we all do our part, as responsible and well-informed individuals, to ensure that we are taking all reasonable precautions to help put an end to the deadly pandemic that continues to sicken and kill so many people.



New guidance from the *Centers for Disease Control*, as well as New York State and the Federal Government are strongly recommending that **ALL** persons again wear a mask—regardless of vaccine status—when in certain areas or in large group settings, to break the chain of infection and stop the spread of the virus. I urge all in our parish to heed this guidance and resume wearing a mask when attending Mass in person. Likewise, all persons who are eligible to get the Covid-19 vaccine are strongly urged to get it. It would be a cruel shame if we lose all the ground that has otherwise been covered in the past seventeen months because of a lack of vaccination and thus, widespread infection. The new strain of Covid-19—the Delta variant—is extremely lethal and is more easily transmitted. Sadly, the majority of those who are contracting the new strain are those who had not gotten the vaccine. Please, if you have not yet gotten the vaccine, do so in order to prevent yourself, and others, from getting the virus. It is an act of Christian love!






ONGOING FOOD DRIVE: PLEASE HELP!
