Some 30 Christians arrested under Uttar Pradesh's anti-conversion law

The law criminalises religious conversion, except in the case of the reconversion to Hinduism. According to a report by International Christian Concern, 30 Christians were arrested in July, up from previous months.

Mumbai, India - Asia News reported that police recently arrested nine Christians in Uttar Pradesh for allegedly violating the state's controversial anti-conversion law, which criminalises religious conversion and denies bail to those accused. The case is cited in a study by International Christian Concern (ICC), a Christian advocacy group, which reports a recent rise in anti-Christian complaints. The document quotes one of the Christians, Sadhu Srinivas Gautham, who said that about 25 Hindu radicals stormed a prayer meeting, accusing those present of forcibly converting Hindus to Christianity. "They raged against me," Gautham said. "It was as if they wanted to kill me on the spot. However, police arrived and escorted us to the police station" where he and six other Christians were charged with violating the anti-conversion law. "They told us we should renounce our Christian faith and go back to Hinduism." According to the anti-conversion law, approved last February, "Ghar Wapsi" (homecoming), the reconversion to Hinduism, is not forced conversion, even if it is often accompanied by threats and intimidation.



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS OSSINING COUNCIL #311

Ossining Council #311 was founded on May 1st, 1898. It includes the communities of St. Ann's, St. Augustine's, & St. Theresa's Parishes. It is one of the oldest active Knights of Columbus Councils in the nation at 123 years old.

The Knights of Columbus was founded on the principles of charity, unity, and fraternity. It was established by Fr. Michael J. McGivney, who was an assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church at the time in New Haven, CT. Together with a group of parishioners, Fr. McGivney founded the organization in 1882. Their intent? To bring financial and other assistance to the sick, disabled, and needy in the community, and their families.

The Knights here in Ossining are living up to those principles every day of the week, by supporting the Church, the Parish Priests, the Parishioners, and the Community. Some of the parish activities we support include the Midnight Run, the Parish Festival, the Lenten Fish Fry, Coffee Weekends after Mass, Children's Basketball and Soccer Contests, various High School Scholarships and the Ossining Food Pantry. Some community activities we support, volunteer at, or run include: wheel chairs for the disabled, Veteran Masses at the VA hospital, and sonogram machines for Expectant Mother Care. The Knights also provide financial aid to many community organizations such as Habitat for Humanity, Sisters of Life, Hudson Link and the Rotary Club. The majority of the Knights are also members of other parish ministries.
