## THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### INITIATIVES ON EUCHARIST AIM TO GIVE CATHOLICS BETTER UNDERSTANDING

**WASHINGTON** — The Catholic News Service reported that this past June at their annual meeting, the U.S. bishops spoke about helping Catholics come to a deeper understanding and appreciation for the Eucharist through an upcoming Eucharistic revival and a document on the Eucharist. The bishops plan to continue talking about these church actions and will vote on the Communion document during their November meeting in Baltimore. But in the meantime, two U.S. bishops — who head the committees working on these initiatives — spoke recently on a recorded video roundtable produced by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to further explain just what the bishops hope to achieve through the upcoming revival and document on the Eucharist. The half-hour video will air on Catholic television networks such as NET-TV, a Catholic television network based in Brooklyn, New York. In the recorded video, Auxiliary Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens of St. Paul and Minneapolis and Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of Fort Wayne-South Bend, Indiana, (Bishop Cozzens is chair of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis and Bishop Rhoades is chair of the Committee on Doctrine) speak of the Bishops initiative. It is important for the bishops to give an “official voice” on what these initiatives are, and what they are not, during this “significant moment for the Church in the United States.” The Eucharistic revival is meant to be an act of evangelization for some and a reawakening of understanding for others, she said, while the document on the Eucharist, which has gained more public attention, is meant to be more of a “teaching tool to be incorporated into” the planned revival. Bishop Cozzens said the impetus for the bishops’ work on a Eucharistic revival was a Pew study in the fall of 2019 that showed just 30% of Catholics “have what we might call a proper understanding of Christ’s presence in the Eucharist.” The bishops saw this as an opportunity to increase Catholics’ understanding and awareness of the Eucharist with a revival that is set to launch on the feast of Corpus Christi in June 2022. Bishop Cozzens said what will be a three-year process will include events on the diocesan level such as Eucharistic processions around the country along with adoration and prayer. The bishop said this spotlight on the Eucharist will emphasize that it is such a great gift to the church. He also said the focus of this revival will not just be for parish priests to run another program but for Catholic groups and movements to be involved in reaching out and explaining the meaning of the Eucharist to Catholics. Bishop Rhoades said he was excited about this revival and feels the document that his committee will present to the bishops this fall, “The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church,” will be a good contribution to it. He said the document will focus on how “the Eucharist is our greatest treasure as Catholics” and will look at different aspects of the Eucharist, particularly how it illustrates Christ’s sacrifice and is the real presence of Jesus, not just a symbol. The second half of the document will emphasize what Catholics should do with this deeper understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist from more active participation at Mass to participating in devotions such as adoration and then renewing their commitment to serve others. When asked how the two initiatives fit together, Bishop Cozzens said he thought the document on the Eucharist would “become a sort of launching pad for the revival.” He urged Catholics to really pray for this Eucharistic revival, recognizing that “what ultimately is going to change the world is the Holy Spirit.” Bishop Rhoades similarly encouraged people to pray for the revival and then to participate in any way they can and spread the word about it. “Evangelize. Be evangelizers of the Eucharist,” he said.

### ANGLICAN BISHOP CONVERTS TO CATHOLICISM

**LONDON** – The Spectator from London reported that Bishop Michael Nazir-Ali, the retired Anglican Bishop of Rochester, has been received into the Catholic Church and hopes to be ordained a Catholic priest, to serve in the Anglican ordinariate. Born in Pakistan, Bishop Nazir-Ali was Bishop of Rochester from 1994 to 2009, and was once considered a likely candidate to become Archbishop of Canterbury. Although usually identified with the Evangelical wing of the Church of England, he explained his conversion in terms of a desire to maintain the Anglo-Catholic tradition. He said: “I believe that the Anglican desire to adhere to apostolic, patristic, and conciliar teaching can now best be maintained in the Ordinariate.” Twelve Anglican bishops have now entered the Catholic Church in the last 20 years. Because he is married, Nazir-Ali, who is 72 years old, cannot be considered for ordination as a Catholic bishop. The conversion of such a high-profile intellectual would be an enormous boost for the Catholic Ordinariate, set up by Pope Benedict XVI to receive Anglicans into the Roman Catholic Church. Friends of Nazir-Ali say that he has already converted and is now a member of the Ordinariate which over the years has seen several Anglican clergy, many of them married, serve as Catholic priests. Its services are distinctively Anglican in style and include passages from the Book of Common Prayer. Pakistan-born Nazir-Ali, 72, was Bishop of Rochester from 1994 until 2009, when he resigned his post to set up a center in Oxford dedicated to promoting orthodox evangelism and dialogue with other faiths.




### ALL SOULS DAY INDULGENCE

It is during the month of November that the Church meditates on the Communion of Saints, which is the link with the faithful who have already reached heaven (the Church Triumphant), the faithful departed who are still expiating their sins in Purgatory (the Church Suffering) and of the pilgrim faithful still here on earth (the Church Militant). On the first of November the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation, honoring all those faithful in heaven, the known and unknown saints. The feast began the traditional Octave of All Saints, November 1-8. November 2nd is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, also known as All Souls Day, a day set aside to pray for all the dead. All Souls Day shifts the Church’s focus on praying for the Faithful Departed throughout November. The need and duty of prayer for the dead has been acknowledged by the Church. It is recommended in the Scriptures of the Old Testament: “It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins” (2 Macc. 12: 46). This duty is expressed in public and private prayers but especially in the offering of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the repose of souls. The prayers are particularly directed for the souls who are being purified in Purgatory, waiting for the day when they will join the saints in heaven. The celebration of Mass is the highest means the Church can provide for charity for the dead, but we can also relieve their sufferings through our prayers, sufferings and penances. We can particularly help the Poor Souls by doing acts and prayers that have indulgences attached to them. An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from November 1-8; on other days of the year it is only a partial indulgence. The plenary indulgence is earned under the usual conditions: sacramental confession (within 20 days before or after), one Eucharistic Communion for each visit (20 days before or after), and prayer for the Pope’s intentions (usually one Our Father and the Creed or Hail Mary, prayed each visit) while detached from sin.
