

GAUDETE SUNDAY IS ALSO "BAMBINELLI SUNDAY" PINK!

Next Sunday, Holy Mother Church celebrates the Third Sunday in

Advent, also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is Latin for rejoice and comes from Philippians 4:4-5, "*Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.*" This is the Introit, the entrance antiphon, for Mass and also the first line of the second reading. Gaudete Sunday marks the halfway point in Advent, and we change things up a bit to provide encouragement to continue our Advent practices. We light the lone rose (pink) candle in our Advent wreaths, the Mass readings challenge us to cry out and sing joyfully as we continue waiting, and many priests wear rose-colored vestments.

Feel free to wear Pink to Holy Mass next week!

We will be blessing the Baby Jesus figurines at all the Masses next weekend as part of the tradition of Bambinelli Sunday. Pope Saint John Paul II, during his papacy, instituted the celebration of "Bambinelli Sunday" on the Third Sunday of Advent—a day on which children from Rome bring the figurine of the Christ Child from their families' Nativity sets to the Church to be blessed. Then after the Holy Father blesses the statues of Baby Jesus, the children will take them back to their homes to be placed under their Christmas trees. Pope Francis has continued the tradition, blessing the statuettes which children bring before him. Parishes around the world join in the celebration, encouraging young children to make the connection between the Nativity set at home and the local church where they worship each weekend. Dear friends in the Lord:

Recently, Pope Francis noted that "there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel." Your gift, which will be collected on December 12 offers support that helps religious communities provide loving care for older members while ensuring younger ones can continue the good works of their elders.



(a Holy Day of Obligation) "The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception,

the patronal feast of the United States, is a Holy Day of Obligation. Because this feast honoring Mary, the Mother of God, celebrates one of the most important events in salvation history. "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who

have recourse to thee."

We declare, pronounce, and define that the doctrine which holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin, is a doctrine revealed by God and therefore to be believed firmly and constantly by all the faithful."

Aspiration to Mary (A Prayer repeated throughout the day) "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."
