GAUDETE SUNDAY IS ALSO "BAMBINELLI SUNDAY" PINK!

Next Sunday, December 15th, Holy Mother Church celebrates the Third Sunday in

Advent, also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is Latin for rejoice and comes from Philippians 4:4-5, "*Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.*" This is the Introit, the entrance antiphon, for Mass. Gaudete Sunday marks the halfway point in Advent, and we change things up a bit to provide encouragement to continue our Advent practices. We light the lone rose (pink) candle in our Advent wreaths, the Mass readings challenge us to cry out and sing joyfully as we continue waiting, and many priests wear rose-colored vestments.

Feel free to wear Pink to Holy Mass next week!

We will be blessing the Baby Jesus figurines at all the Masses next weekend as part of the tradition of Bambinelli Sunday. Pope Saint John Paul II, during his papacy, instituted the celebration of "Bambinelli Sunday" on the Third Sunday of Advent—a day on which children from Rome bring the figurine of the Christ Child from their families' Nativity sets to the Church to be blessed. Then after the Holy Father blesses the statues of Baby Jesus, the children will take them back to their homes to be placed under their Christmas trees. Pope Francis has continued the tradition, blessing the statuettes which children bring before him. Parishes around the world join in the celebration, encouraging young children to make the connection between the Nativity set at home and the local church where they worship each weekend.





The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a Catholic lay organization, dedicated to serving the poor while deepening our relationship with God through that service. Our local Conference was formed here at St. Augustine's in March 2010. Since that time, we have served many of our local brothers and sisters, regardless of race or religion, with matters such as: small short-term financial assistance, home visits, referrals to assistance for services that we can't provide, and a compassionate presence to those who are suffering. Specifically, over the past year we have provided monetary assistance for a senior to move into senior housing; provided weeks of meals for the Ossining Homeless Shelter; partially paid a single mother's electric bill; assisted the widow of a recently deceased Vet with a security deposit; gave out numerous food shopping cards; and donated backpacks, coats, toys, and gift cards to local service organizations. Our Conference is made up of volunteers from St. Augustine's who are dedicated to serving those in need but none of this would be possible without your generous support and prayers.

December 8th Season of Advent

Dear friends in the Lord:

As we approach the annual collection for the *Retirement Fund for Religious*— an appeal that benefits nearly 25,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests — I reflect on the ministry of women and men religious past and present — and I am grateful for the ways they have shaped my own faith. I also value the tremendous service they have offered our archdiocese.

In their younger years, they laid the foundation for Catholic schools, parish religious education programs, hospitals, and works of mercy with very little compensation, leaving their religious communities with a shortage of retirement savings. Today, many serve in volunteer ministry. Others are frail and need assistance. Yet all remain committed to their vocations, accepting the limitations of aging and embracing the opportunity to spend more time praying for our Church and world.

Your gift, which will be collected on December 15, offers support that helps religious communities provide loving care for older members while ensuring younger ones can continue the good works of their elders. Rising health care costs and decreased income compound the challenge to meet day-to-day needs for medications, nursing assistance, and other necessities. Over 20 congregations in the archdiocese received more than \$2,000,000 in grants from this national collection.

While I write to you today and express my thanks for last year's contribution of \$415,957, I am also grateful to you for your support of the *Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal* which, in addition to other worthy causes, helps our retired archdiocesan priests at the St. John Vianney Clergy Residence in Riverdale.
