OTHER SACRAMENTS

RECONCILIATION: Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3:30 – 4 p.m., or any time by appointment.

BAPTISM: Baptisms take place on the third Sunday of each month, following the Noon Mass. Call the office to schedule a date. First-time parents are asked to attend a Baptismal preparation class.

MARRIAGE: Engaged couples seeking to be married at St. Lawrence are asked to contact the parish office one year in advance, due to the meetings needed to prepare for this Sacrament. This should be done before any reception plans.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND: Call the parish office to make arrangements for a visit from Father (which can also include Anointing and Confession), a Deacon, or an Extraordinary Minister. In the case of hospital stays, patient privacy laws prevent hospitals from releasing names. Please call the office if you, or someone you know, has been admitted.

JANUARY

Janus was the name of a Roman god and the month of January was named after him. The god Janus had two faces. One face looked backward to what was and the other one looked forward toward a new beginning. We know the Babylonians celebrated a new year in March with the start of spring planting. But when the Romans adopted the Julian calendar in 46B.C. the beginning of each year was officially started in January to honor the god Janus because Rome ruled the world. But the Romans still kept the custom of offering sacrifices and making promises (resolutions) of good behavior for the new year.

Each year, Boys Town, sends out a booklet of information from the Old Farmers Almanac, founded by Robert B. Thomas in 1792 and still published today by Yankee Publishing Co. In New Hampshire.

The current booklet gives this information.

"If you think about it the land and the seasons, the timing of early January makes sense for most of Europe and for north America too. The active harvest season has passed. The holiday frenzy is ending.

As our founder, Robert B. Thomas said, this is a time "of leisure to farmers...settle accounts with your neighbors...now having been industrious in the summer, you will have the felicity of retiring from the turbulence of the storm to the bosom of your family."

"A Boston newspaper from 1813 featured the first recorded use of the phrase "New Year resolution." "the article states: "And yet, I believe there are multitudes of people, accustomed to receive injunctions of new year resolutions, who will sin all the month of December with a serious determination of beginning the new year with new resolutions and new behaviour, and with the full belief that they shall thus expiate and wipe away all their former faults."
