OTHER SACRAMENTS

RECONCILIATION: Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3:30 - 4 p.m., or any time by appointment.

BAPTISM: Baptisms take place on the third Sunday of each month, following the Noon Mass. Call the office to schedule a date. First-time parents are asked to attend a Baptismal preparation class.

MARRIAGE: Engaged couples seeking to be married at St. Lawrence are asked to contact the parish office one year in advance, due to the meetings needed to prepare for this Sacrament. This should be done before any reception plans.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND: Call the parish office to make arrangements for a visit from Father (which can also include Anointing and Confession), a Deacon, or an Extraordinary Minister. In the case of hospital stays, patient privacy laws prevent hospitals from releasing names. Please call the office if you, or someone you know, has been admitted.

SAINT THOMAS AQUINAS

Italian Dominican theologian Saint Thomas Aguinas was one of the most influential medieval thinkers of Scholasticism and the father of the Thomistic school of theology. Combining the of faith theological principals with the philosophical principles of reason, Saint Thomas Aquinas ranked among the most influential thinkers. An authority of the Roman Catholic church and a prolific writer, Aquinas died on March 7th 1274, at the Cistercian monastery of Fossanova, near Terracina, Latium, Papal States, Italy. After completing his education, Saint Thomas Aquinas devoted himself to a life of traveling, writing, teaching, public speaking preaching. Religious institutions and and universities alike yearned to benefit from the wisdom of "The Christian Apostle."

SAINT ANGELA MERICI

Born in 1474 at Desenzano on the shore of Lake Garda, Italy, St. Angela Merici became a tertiary of St. Francis at fifteen years of age. In a vision God revealed to her that she would establish a "company" to promote the welfare of souls. At Desenzano she established a school for the instruction of young girls and a second school at Brescia. She gathered around her twelve religious companions and founded the Ursulines at Brescia.

Her idea of education was very different from that of a convent school. She preferred to send her followers to teach girls in their own families. For it was her belief that "disorder in society is the result of disorder in the family."

In the year of her death, 1540, it was estimated that at least half the town of Brescia was Lutheran or Calvinist. However, the schools of Ursulines did their share in strengthening and extending Catholicism and in safeguarding Italy from what we now term "modern unbelief" (Lives of the Saints)
