Eucharistic Adoration: First Monday of the Month 7-8 p.m.

OTHER SACRAMENTS

RECONCILIATION: Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3:30 - 4 p.m., or any time by appointment.

BAPTISM: Baptisms take place on the third Sunday of each month, following the Noon Mass. Call the office to schedule a date. First-time parents are asked to attend a Baptismal preparation class.

MARRIAGE: Engaged couples seeking to be married at St. Lawrence are asked to contact the parish office one year in advance, due to the meetings needed to prepare for this Sacrament. This should be done before any reception plans.

MINISTRY TO THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND: Call the parish office to make arrangements for a visit from Father (which can also include Anointing and Confession), a Deacon, or an Extraordinary Minister. In the case of hospital stays, patient privacy laws prevent hospitals from releasing names. Please call the office if you, or someone you know, has been admitted.

He was born in Roman Britain and when he was 14 or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. At that time, Ireland was a land of Druids and pagans but Patrick turned to God. The love of God and his fear grew more and more as so did his faith. He prayed as many as a hundred prayers in a single day as well as the night. His captivity lasted till he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. FASTING AND ABSTINENCE LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

Good Friday is a day of **fast and abstinence**. All other **Fridays** of Lent are days of **abstinence**. The obligation to fast applies only to <u>Catholics between</u> <u>the ages of 18 and 59</u>. Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger. The obligation of abstinence applies to <u>all Catholics who have</u> <u>reached the age of 14</u>. **Abstinence** in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.
