

## The Feast of the Epiphany - The Story of Christmas Continues

It is believed that the Three Wise Men, also known as Magi or Kings— Melchior, Gaspar (also called Caspar) and Balthazar — gifted Jesus with gold to signify his status as King of the Jews, frankincense representing the infant's identity as the Son of God; and finally, myrrh that touched upon Jesus' mortality

December 25 is the day we observe the birth of the baby Jesus in a stable/cave in Bethlehem. The story, however, does not end there. In many countries, there are a few Christian traditions that are carried on for 12 days.

The 12-day tradition ends around January 6, which is known as the feast of the Epiphany. On this day, people believe that the magi or three wise men or three kings came to see the new born baby Jesus.

## Who were the three wise men and what did they bring?

The three wise men are identified as Melchior, Gaspar (also called Caspar) and Balthazar. The first wise man hailed from Persia while the second and third hailed from India and Arabia respectively.

Usually, on Christmas day, people depict and understand that the three wise men/magi/kings came to the stable/cave in Bethlehem, but by traditional celebrations they visited him on the 12th day post-Christmas.

### Significance of the Epiphany:

The Three Kings Day or Epiphany, is an official recognition and commemoration of the arrival of the Magi; hence resulting to be one of oldest holidays in the Christian calendar. However, Roman Catholics celebrate this special feast of the Epiphany on January 6. However, this year, Epiphany is being celebrated on January 2.

Reference to these three wise men/magi/kings is made in Chapter 2 of the Gospel of Matthew. According to the Gospel, the wise men/magi/kings had followed a big bright star that took them to the house where Jesus, Mary and Joseph were. They then presented Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

Frankincense was a type of incense that was very expensive. Myrrh was a perfume in olden times and in ancient Egypt. It was also used in embalming processes. It would also be used in the oil to anoint kings.

Today we are asked to imitate the Magi. They do not debate; they set out. They do not stop to look, but enter the house of Jesus. They do not put themselves at the center, but bow down before the One who is the center.





## Why Is There A Star On Top Of My Christmas Tree?

There are many different toppers that people put on the top of their Christmas trees. Many people display a star on their Christmas tree.

The gospel of Matthew 2:1-2 says, "After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in

Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, 'Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him.'"

When the Magi saw the star, they studied the words of the prophets and understood that the star was announcing the birth of a king.

Their first stop was in Jerusalem where they checked with King Herod. Surely, a king would be born in the palace, surrounded by royalty! King Herod, however, knew nothing of this new king. Herod spoke to his advisers who told the King that the prophets declared the baby would be born in Bethlehem.

Herod passed this information onto the Magi, sending them on their way to Bethlehem to look for the child. Herod asked the Magi to let him know when they found the child so that he might come and pay his respects as well. In reality, Herod intended to kill the baby. He would not take any chances that a messiah might have entered the world who would one day take his throne from him.

Matthew then wrote of the Magi, "After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed." (Matthew 2:9-10) The star led the Magi right to the house where Jesus and His family were. "They entered the house where the child and his mother, Mary, were, and they fell down before him and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasure chests and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11)

Clearly, the Magi understood that this child was no ordinary Baby. They had been directed to His location by a supernatural star in the sky. They worshiped Him and presented gifts provides us with an idea of how important they understood this Child's birth to be. When the Magi were ready to leave, they did not report back to Herod. God had spoken to them in a dream not to return to Jerusalem. Instead, they just mounted their camels and started for home.

After the star guided the Magi to where the Baby was, it was never referred to again. The star had done its job and pointed the way to Jesus. Even though this special star would never be heard from again, Jesus Himself would be referred to as, "the Light of the World." Listen to how John describes Jesus, "The light shines through the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it...The one who is the true light, who gives light to everyone, was going to come into the world." (John 1:5,9).
