PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Family Parish,

Do you remember the many religious movies that used to be on the television? How about The Ten Commandments with Charlton Heston? Who could forget the scenes such as the turning of the river into blood or the leading the people out of Egypt as the waters parted? Another scene is when God presented the Ten Commandments to Moses. The carving of the words of God on the stone tablets. Then presentation of the Law to the people.

Jesus answers a question about the Ten Commandments this weekend. Although the pharisees were attempting to test him, Jesus reminds us that the greatest commandment in the law is to love God and the second is to love our neighbor.

Do you know the names of your neighbors? The families that live in the houses or apartments around. Years ago, many would be able to say the names of the others living around them. That is probably more than we can say today.

In the use of the word neighbor, Jesus goes beyond those that live close to us. He calls us to see all people as our neighbor. In particular, those that are the most vulnerable and abandoned. The first reading, from the book of Exodus, recognizes that love must be extended to the foreign immigrant, the widow and the orphan.

Recently, on October 3rd, Pope Francis signed his most recent encyclical, Fratelli tutti (Brothers to all), in Assisi. A deep meaning celebrating the devotion to St. Francis for his feast day. In this encyclical, our holy father invites us to reflect and be the means of change on how our world is not expressing this love of neighbor. The holy father challenges us once again to not just read the gospel message, but live it. As Pope Francis recognized that in his simple and direct way, St. Francis expressed the essence of a fraternal openness that allows us to acknowledge, appreciate and love each person, regardless of physical proximity, regardless of where he or she was born or lives.

Let us pray for the grace and blessings necessary to live in true love of God and Neighbor.

MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Estimados feligreses y amigos de la parroquia de la Sagrada Familia,

¿Recuerda las muchas películas religiosas que solían estar en la televisión? ¿Qué tal Los Diez Mandamientos con Charlton Heston? ¿Quién podría olvidar escenas como la transformación del río en sangre o la salida del pueblo de Egipto cuando las aguas se separaron? Otra escena es cuando Dios le presentó los Diez Mandamientos a Moisés. La talla de las palabras de Dios en las tablas de piedra. Luego presentación de la Ley al pueblo.

Jesús responde una pregunta sobre los Diez Mandamientos este fin de semana. Aunque los fariseos intentaban probarlo, Jesús nos recuerda que el mayor mandamiento de la ley es amar a Dios y el segundo es amar a nuestro prójimo.

¿Conoce los nombres de sus vecinos? Las familias que viven en las casas o apartamentos de los alrededores. Hace años, muchos podían decir los nombres de los que vivían a su alrededor. Probablemente sea más de lo que podemos decir hoy.

En el uso de la palabra prójimo, Jesús va más allá de los que viven cerca de nosotros. Nos llama a ver a todas las personas como prójimos. En particular, aquellos que son los más vulnerables y abandonados. La primera lectura, del libro del Éxodo, reconoce que el amor debe extenderse al inmigrante extranjero, a la viuda y al huérfano.

Recientemente, el 3 de octubre, el Papa Francisco firmó su encíclica más reciente, Fratelli tutti (Hermanos a todos), en Asís. Un significado profundo que celebra la devoción a San Francisco para su fiesta. En esta encíclica, nuestro santo padre nos invita a reflexionar y ser el medio de cambio sobre cómo nuestro mundo no expresa este amor al prójimo. El santo padre nos desafía una vez más no solo a leer el mensaje del evangelio, sino a vivirlo. Como el Papa Francisco reconoció que a su manera simple y directa, San Francisco expresó la esencia de una apertura fraterna que nos permite reconocer, apreciar y amar a cada persona, sin importar la proximidad física, sin importar dónde nació o vive.

Oremos por la gracia y las bendiciones necesarias para vivir en verdadero amor a Dios y al prójimo.

*A Sunday Reflection

The Greatest Commandment:

“You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, [with all your strength,] and with all your mind. You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” Mt 22:37-39; Lk 10:27; Mk 12:30-31

Again, we are presented with the main truth of our existence that we learned as the first principles of our faith: The Purpose of Man’s Existence. That principal is to *know, love* and *serve* God. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* I:1

This is God’s love in truth for the world: That His love, wisdom and creation be manifest in Man through his Son, Jesus Christ. This is the image of God that both the Old and New Testaments teach us. There is no other greater truth than this for the universe. It is this simple and it is this difficult in the same breath. Because it also means we must love all persons as Jesus loves us, and treat His creation and gifts as things that we don’t own, but rather share.

Are we Christians truly followers of Jesus Christ? We follow weather patterns, we follow events, we follow people on electronic gadgets, but do we follow Our Lord with the same fervor? Have we replaced God in our lives with images, things, wants and ideas? Is our society using euphemisms of justice, security, empowerment and choice to replace God in the psyche of the human person?

Saint Paul alludes to this very understanding when he instructs the Colossians (Col 1:15-20) that our image of the world should be through Jesus Christ, the Son, because through the Son we are brought into the “fullness” of all creation that is God the Father and receive through Him the Ever-living Spirit. The Father and Son are one and have existed before all creation, but for our sake the Father sent the Son so that we may know Him beyond any doubt that we are of His image created.

It is also implied that through the Son, Jesus Christ, we are redeemed of our sins, and our souls taken up with His to where He has prepared for us a place with the Father. Jn 14:2-4

So, the Greatest Commandment is the universal truth, and a love for the one who gives us everlasting life that is manifested by the sacrificial love we show each other, as did Jesus Christ when He gave us His Body and Blood on the cross and in the Eucharist.
