

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Family Parish,

This weekend, we begin a new liturgical year. The first candle in our Advent wreath will be lit. This candle is often referred to as the Prophecy Candle. Its color, purple, which is the liturgical color for the Advent season, reminds us that this season is a special time of prayer, sacrifices, and penance. The lighting of this Candle is a brilliant symbol of our Hope for the Second Coming of Jesus Christ.

The long-awaited hope that was part of the teaching of the prophets, the kings and all who shared in the relationship with God before the birth of Jesus. God granted these holy people the grace of Hope to sustain them and let them not to fall into despair and discouragement of sadness, grief, trials, adversities, tribulations, and evils around them. They clung on such hope that one day the Paradise of God would be open again to the souls of the just.

This "Hope," represented by the First Purple Candle, is not merely a plain kind of 'hope' to overcome our small and big problems in life. It is not simply about hoping to get through our day-to-day life. This one is a symbol of our ultimate hope in the eternal life in the Kingdom of God.

But the good news is that this heavenly hope also sparks in our hearts that humanly hope which we need in this world. Whether we suffer seemingly 'impossible' or 'unsolvable' problems, or whatever trials we're going through right now, we must deal with them with hope- to see them through the eyes of God, and not with the eyes of the world.

What difficulties are you experiencing right now? Suffering from sickness? Or are you unable to do a lot of things because of financial constraints, honest debts, and poverty? Is your life filled with sadness or pain?

As we light this first candle of the Advent wreath this year, let us ask that we may be overcome with this divine hope. May the reflection of this hope in our words and actions be a spark to bring this hope to one another.

Su color, el púrpura, que es el color litúrgico del tiempo de Adviento, nos recuerda que este tiempo es un tiempo especial de oración, sacrificios y penitencia. El encendido de esta Vela es un símbolo brillante de nuestra Esperanza por la Segunda Venida de Jesucristo.

*A Sunday Reflection

**Jesus taught His Disciples before His persecution and Passion on the cross: “Be vigilant! Be alert! For you know not when the [judgment] time will arrive.”
Mk 13:33**

We can usually accept the death of a loved one following a long period of sickness, however we are generally shaken by news that announces an unforeseen death by accident or illness. Why do we make a distinction between these two conditions? A typical reasoning is the lack of preparation that is afforded both the bereaved and the dead. We wish to slowly get acquainted with the imminent loss rather than suddenly, so that we can make “arrangements” or “customize” our lives around the death. Rom 8:6 Even so, some don’t want to face reality even when confronted with it. Why is this condition so foreign to us? Is there a reason why we don’t care to discuss it, as a fact of our life?

Here Jesus is talking about His own departure, the brutal and torturous death He must endure for His disciples’ sake, but beyond the obvious, He is preparing them to endure all calamity no matter how blatantly dreadful or horrifying it may be. Death of the body should not discourage the follower of Christ from acting with love for the truth. Mt 10:28 Preparing for death and being prepared for death is how we should live every day that we are granted. Once our souls are prepared, vigilance is the driving force to keep working in God’s vineyard and producing its fruit until we are called. Eschatology of the soul is the real topic that Jesus figuratively introduces for the Disciples. And this is how Isaiah refers to it as well, when he remarks: “For you [Lord] are our father. Were Abraham not to know us, nor Israel to acknowledge us, still, You, Lord, are our father, Our Redeemer is your name since eternity.” Is 63:16

So, life and death in Him should be our only concern. The dead are not necessarily concerned with us, and the faithful may not be concerned with us, but you Lord are concerned. From our birth you have given us our redemption in You. This is the judgment: whether we will our souls to Yours or not. Be vigilant of your soul’s everlasting life, that it not be given or thrown away to the fires of damnation. “When people are saying, ‘Peace and security,’ then suddenly disaster strikes, but you, brothers [and sisters], you are the children of the light and of the day. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, rather let us stay alert and sober, encouraging one another and building up one another [in faith].” 1Thes 5:3a,5a,6,11
