PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Family Parish:

One of my favorite people in the bible is Moses. We all remember Moses was chosen from God to deliver the Israelites from slavery by the Egyptians. The image of Moses and the people crossing the Red Sea is powerful. God gave the direction of the people to the chosen land. Our Lenten pilgrimage of 40 days is a reflection of the journey of the Israelites for 40 years in the desert.

Our first reading this weekend is the account of Moses receiving the Ten Commandments from God. When I think about the Ten Commandments, I remember my preparation for First Confession and Holy Communion. Every year we work the children, I fondly recall those years gone by. As Catholics, we believe in the effects of the celebration of Confession to absolve us of our sins – a theme that is a part of our Lenten practices.

The great temple in Jerusalem was the center of Jewish life and worship. It was only at the Temple that sacrifices could be offered to God. The offering of sacrifices was an important part of the covenant and of Jewish worship. The offering of the sacrifices for the forgiveness of sins took place at the altar of sacrifice in the temple. Listening to Jesus talk about the temple struck a central practice in his day. The days of the sacrifice of himself on the cross for our sins was approaching.

Jesus invites us to consider the celebration of the sacrament of confession this Lent. For some, it is a regular practice. For others, it might have been a while since our last confession. Our Lenten schedule includes opportunities for confession. If it has been a while, be assured the priest will walk you through this opportunity of the renewal of God's love for us.

2021 Bishop's Annual Appeal

The devastating global pandemic of 2020 caused the loss of countless lives, widespread critical illness and has impacted every family around the world in so many ways. The important work of Catholic Charities could not and did not stop during this time. Requests for basic services such as food, shelter, and clothing increased and the staff at Catholic Charities truly lived out the Corporal Works of Mercy. Rental assistance and housing support continued. The Catholic Charities food pantry, one of the largest in Warren County, provided curbside delivery and made home deliveries to protect those most at risk of coronavirus. Critical counseling services were made available through tele-health and safe, socially distant visits.

Twenty-four percent – \$1.7 million dollars – of the funds raised by the 2021 Bishop's Annual Appeal is earmarked for Catholic Charities, Diocese of Metuchen. Your generosity and sacrifice helps to ensure that no one is left homeless, hungry, or without emotional support in these extremely difficult times.

MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Estimados feligreses y amigos de la parroquia de la Sagrada Familia,

Una de mis personas favoritas en la Biblia es Moisés. Todos recordamos que Moisés fue elegido por Dios para liberar a los israelitas de la esclavitud de los egipcios. La imagen de Moisés y el pueblo que cruza el Mar Rojo es poderosa. Dios dio la dirección del pueblo a la tierra elegida. Nuestra peregrinación de Cuaresma de 40 días es un reflejo del viaje de los israelitas durante 40 años en el desierto.

Nuestra primera lectura de este fin de semana es el relato de Moisés recibiendo los Diez Mandamientos de Dios. Cuando pienso en los Diez Mandamientos, recuerdo mi preparación para la Primera Confesión y la Sagrada Comunión. Cada año trabajamos con los niños, recuerdo con cariño aquellos años pasados. Como católicos creemos en los efectos de la celebración de la Confesión para absolvernos de nuestros pecados. Un tema que forma parte de nuestras prácticas de Cuaresma.

El gran templo de Jerusalén era el centro de la vida y el culto judíos. Solo en el Templo se podían ofrecer sacrificios a Dios. La ofrenda de sacrificios era una parte importante del pacto y del culto judío. La ofrenda de los sacrificios para el perdón de los pecados tuvo lugar en el altar del sacrificio en el templo. Escuchar a Jesús hablar sobre el templo fue una práctica central en su época. Se acercaban los días del sacrificio de sí mismo en la cruz por nuestros pecados.

Jesús nos invita a considerar la celebración del sacramento de la confesión en esta Cuaresma. Para algunos, es una práctica habitual. Para otros, podría haber pasado un tiempo desde nuestra última confesión. Nuestro horario de Cuaresma incluye oportunidades para la confesión. Si ha pasado un tiempo, tenga la seguridad de que el sacerdote lo guiará a través de esta oportunidad de la renovación del amor de Dios por nosotros.

La devastadora pandemia mundial de 2020 causó la pérdida de innumerables vidas, enfermedades graves generalizadas y ha afectado a todas las familias del mundo de muchas maneras. *A Sunday Reflection

“Take these out of here, and stop making my Father’s house a marketplace.” Jesus said in the temple area to the money-changers and animal sellers. Jn 2:16; Mk 11:17

When Jesus talks about worship He means it in the sense of transforming one’s soul to God. This is the New Testament Christian understanding of worship in the resurrected Christ, who has been offered up by the Father “to die once and for all” for the redemption of our sins. Rom 6:10; Heb 9:24-28 Jesus here is not talking about the ritual worship of presenting animal offerings as sacrifice for sins once a year in the Jerusalem Temple that the Jews were used to at the time. He is talking about worship of God in the supernatural sense. Rom 12:1-2 In the New Covenant, worship of God is a sacrifice in the temple of the Holy Spirit within us.

“Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.” Jn 2:19

Therefore, the New Covenant with God and man is inside us, the covenant of the Holy Spirit within God’s greatest masterpiece, man. The sacrifices that we make are in our own temples under the roof of our heads. Under this unworthy roof comes Jesus Christ, in Body, Soul and Divinity to transform us with His graces when we receive the transubstantiated sacrifice of the Mass, the Eucharist.

The Old Covenant of Moses (Ex 20:1-17) was a physical manifestation of God on His people with all its precepts, but the New Covenant is a supernatural manifestation of God on our souls. So when Jesus says to His Disciples if you love me you will keep My Commandments (Jn 14:15,21;15:10), He means this not just outwardly for everyone to see, but rather inwardly for His Father to see. This is the true change the New Covenant has brought to mankind: “Dying You destroyed our death, Rising You restored our life.” In the sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus Christ’s death on the cross and resurrection on the third day is transubstantiated into the Eucharist of the Mass, the physical presence of His Body and Blood.

So, this is how we serve our God, whom we cannot see, by imitating His son, Jesus Christ through our actions towards others, that our almsgiving may be secret. Jn 14:12,23 And Our Father, who sees in secret will repay us. Mt 6:4 It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give You thanks, almighty and eternal God, through Your Son, Jesus Christ Our Lord.
