PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Family Parish,

Jesus often used parables to teach people and to make a point. Parables are a Jewish style of storytelling. The stories are drawn from ordinary life. Parables usually contain some element that is strange or unusual. This weekend, we come across the familiar parable of the Kingdom of God and the mustard seed.

The use of the image of a kingdom and a plant was used in the Old Testament scriptures. Our first reading taken from the writings of Ezekiel spoke of the strong Lebanon cedar tree. Cedar wood was very expensive. It was a wood that needed to be imported at the time. Cedar was used in the construction of the palace and the temple in Jerusalem. Ezekiel was alive after Israel was conquered by the Babylonians. The king and the people were in exile. Ezekiel reminds the people that no situation is beyond the redemptive power of God who is greater than even the mighty cedar. Ezekiel said that the lofty cedar (kingdom of Jerusalem) will be restored. A remnant of the old would be taken and placed by God to grow strong. The fulness of the growth would be in Jesus.

In the parable of the mustard seed, Jesus is inviting us to look at the growth of the Kingdom of God. Jesus, the sower, planted the seed. The mustard seed represents the Gospel, being received by a few and then growing to reach millions throughout the world in the passing of the ages. To the listeners of the day, the use of a mustard seed demonstrates the unusual characteristic of a parable. They would have been familiar with the Lebanon Cedar. The use of the mustard seed demonstrates growth of the Kingdom of God including people from all parts of the world for all ages. This is not just limited to the faithful members of God's chosen people. Jesus offers the membership in the Kingdom of God for all who accept and live the Gospel.

MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Estimados feligreses y amigos de la parroquia de la Sagrada Familia,

Jesús usó a menudo parábolas para enseñar a la gente y hacer claro el mensaje. Las parábolas son un estilo judío de narración. Las historias se extraen de la vida cotidiana. Las parábolas suelen contener algún elemento extraño o inusual. Este fin de semana nos encontramos con la conocida parábola del Reino de Dios y la semilla de mostaza.

El uso de la imagen de un reino y una planta se usó en las escrituras del Antiguo Testamento. Nuestra primera lectura, tomada de los escritos de Ezequiel, habló del fuerte cedro del Líbano. La madera de cedro era muy cara. Era una madera que necesitaba ser importada en ese momento. El cedro se utilizó en la construcción del palacio y el templo de Jerusalén. Ezequiel estaba vivo después de que los babilonios conquistaran a Israel. El rey y el pueblo estaban en el destierro. Ezequiel le recuerda a la gente que ninguna situación está más allá del poder redentor de Dios, que es más grande que incluso el cedro poderoso. Ezequiel dijo que el alto cedro (reino de Jerusalén) será restaurado. Dios tomaría y colocaría un remanente de los viejos para que se fortaleciera. La plenitud del crecimiento estaría en Jesús.

En la parábola de la semilla de mostaza, Jesús nos invita a mirar el crecimiento del Reino de Dios. Jesús, el sembrador, plantó la semilla. La semilla de mostaza representa el Evangelio, es recibida por unos pocos y luego crece hasta llegar a millones en todo el mundo con el paso de los tiempos. Para los oyentes del día, el uso de una semilla de mostaza demuestra la característica inusual de una parábola. Habrían estado familiarizados con el cedro del Líbano. El uso de la semilla de mostaza demuestra el crecimiento del Reino de Dios, incluidas personas de todas partes del mundo y de todas las edades. Esto no se limita solo a los miembros fieles del pueblo escogido de Dios. Jesús ofrece la membresía en el Reino de Dios para todos los que aceptan y viven el Evangelio.

A Sunday Reflection by István Horváth
JUNE 13, 2021

Dear Brethren, “We know that should our earthly dwelling be destroyed, we have an eternal place with God, not made with [human] hands in Heaven.” We long to be clothed with this heavenly habitation, because we wish not to reveal our earthly nakedness of death as a result of sin, but rather hide what is mortal under the cloak of life. “Now the one who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit. Although we know that while we are home [or comfortable] in the body, we are away from the Lord, [and as a result must] we walk in faith, not by sight [or understanding].” Once we are away from the body and behold the Lord, we aspire to please Him. “For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he has done in the body, good or evil.” 2Cor 5:1-10

This is a most interesting comment on our earthly pilgrimage by Saint Paul. What Paul is saying is that if we are “comfortable in our skin,” we are part of the world and are not close to Christ’s teaching. Therefore, we may walk in the faith of His resurrection and eternal life, but fall short of achieving it by not perceiving His will for our soul. However, when we behold His Spirit and leave the body behind spiritually, we feel His closeness and want to please Him all the more. This is to be born or re-born in the Spirit of the Trinitarian God.

What a personal relationship we have with Our Lord and God, who reveals to us that He is present everywhere we are now and forever. For this God has raised His Son, Jesus Christ from the death of this world to His right hand in Heaven. By this same merit pouring out His love through blood and water for us, Christ has raised the human person to everlasting life through His Sacred Heart.
