



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Family Parish,

One day, a young boy packed his simple lunch bag. He was going to work in the fields as he had for the season. Little would he know what would happen this day. His simple lunch was shared with more than five thousand others. This miraculous event demonstrates how Jesus could magnify the simple human offerings into the unimaginable.

What began as an ordinary day for a young boy turned out to be his moment of fame. He gathered a few things for his dinner. He included a few barley loaves. They were little rolls of baked barley. A food that was eaten by the less fortunate in his day. He also included two little fish. He happened to be at the place that over five thousand gathered to hear Jesus. From the five barley loaves and two small fish, five thousand men plus women and children ate to their hearts' content until they were satisfied. The leftover fragments were gathered filling twelve baskets.

If Jesus can do this with a simple meal of a young boy, imagine what could be possible with our offerings and works of charity. The final part of the gospel selection says how the people recognized Jesus by accomplishing this miracle. If all He needs is what we have - however small we are or how little we have - then there are miracles yet to be seen and people yet to know Jesus.

Lo que comenzó como un día cualquiera para un joven resultó ser su momento de fama. Reunió algunas cosas para la cena. Incluyó algunos panes de cebada. Eran pequeños rollos de cebada horneada. Un alimento que comían los menos afortunados en su día. También incluyó dos pescados. Él estaba en el lugar donde más de cinco mil se reunieron para escuchar a Jesús. *A Sunday Reflection

**The next few weeks we hear the Gospel according to John interjected into the year of the Gospel of Mark.
Why is this?**

Partly, it is because the Gospel writer, Mark deals only with the facts of the events surrounding Jesus' life and ministry and does not elaborate on the theological or deeper spiritual understanding of Jesus' actions. However, it is also the shortest of the Gospels allowing themes as important as the Bread of Life Discourse from John's Gospel to be fully brought to the attention of the listener over several weeks. Jn 6:22-69

So what is the Bread of Life Discourse? It is probably the most profound and detailed induction into our faith of Catholicism outside of the Last Supper Discourse and the Beatitudes. It provides insight into the true covenant God has made with man as spoken and acted on through His Son, Jesus Christ. Through Jesus' words are revealed the basis and the credo of our faith, that of the forgiveness of sin, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting.

The seven tenets are: Seeking the bread of life, Jesus Christ; Listening to His call and learning His will; Doing the will of the Father as given; Accepting the Spirit of life as granted; Believing in Him as the one sent by the Father; Trusting in Him completely; and Partaking in the banquet of the bread of life, His resurrected body and blood as the true presence of the Father manifested in the Son (the Lamb of God), the Eucharist and viaticum for eternal life.

The multiplication of the loaves of bread (Jn 6:1-15) with its Mosaic symbolism, of manna from heaven, a desolate wilderness, and the feeding of thousands who are facing God's mountain awaiting His Commandments, pre-figures the true "bread of life" that of Jesus Christ, who is God, teacher and food for the human soul. The miraculous sign is so large and so overpowering that the Disciples completely miss the point until Simon Peter utters these words the Spirit has put into his mouth, "You, (Lord) have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Jn 6:68

Indeed, Lord, you are the Holy One, the Holy Mighty One, the Holy Immortal One of God. Let us be filled with the Bread of Life.
