



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Holy Family Parish,

Recently the 2021 Olympics began. The father of the modern Olympics, Baron Pierre de Coubertin, described his vision of the spirit of the Olympics as “the elevation of the mind and soul, overcoming differences between nationalities and cultures, embracing friendship, a sense of solidarity, and fair play; ultimately leading to the contribution towards world peace and the betterment of the world.” He also designed the famous symbol of the 5 rings representing the unity of the five continents. The number five represents Europa, Asia, Africa, Oceanía and North and South America. Antarctica was not included because it was uninhabited.

Thinking of the Olympics, we have to consider the athletes. Each of them with individual stories that bring them to this moment in time. Imagine the history of many great accomplishments with struggles and disappointments represented.

Saint Paul in his letter to Saint Timothy said, “I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith.” This expression of his spiritual journey are the images of Olympic actions. This weekend, St. Paul reminds us that we have been baptized as people of God. We are united into the one family of God. We are called to live a life of holiness. God continues His great love for us in spite of our history of great accomplishments, struggles, and disappointments. He continues to nourish us as the Israelites during their journey of faith.

Today, Jesus reminds each of us of the great source of strength and holiness that He offers in the gift of the Eucharist. Let us pray that our reception of the Eucharist strengthens us on our faith journey and unity.

*A Sunday Reflection
by István Horváth
August 1, 2021*

“Be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on (clothe) the new self (the person Baptized in Christ), created in God’s way in righteousness and holiness of truth.”

Eph 4:23-24

As Jesus begins the Bread of Life Discourse following the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves of bread, He warns us not to come to Him with premeditated intentions or under false pretenses, but with an open mind and new heart. He wants us to completely break with our old ways and as Paul explains, clothe ourselves in the Baptism of God’s righteous and holy truth.

So what does this mean in our lives? It means simply, leave everything behind and save yourself. Exactly, leave behind the material world, the carnal desires and the notions of great learned-ness, because God’s world requires none of these. He will satisfy and equip us with what we need, so we can do His work; He will teach us what we need to know and what to say, so we understand our calling; and He will nourish our body and soul with the Bread of Life (Himself), so that we can withstand the test of the evil in the world. Okay, but can’t we just dress up the old and add what is missing or ‘re-imagine’ our old habits to fit the new mold? NO.

Christ Jesus is the image of the Father. Christ Jesus is the spring of life as we know it. Christ Jesus is the Word of the Father incarnate and is the life of the world into which man was created. Therefore, nothing that was before can go on without God’s life in it. Everything that was before must die and must be given new life in God, the Son. Everything must be re-born in the Trinitarian God to have life everlasting: of water, blood and Spirit must it be born again. The Gentiles are only heirs to the Son through the Spirit of the Law, because they did not observe the Law, but the Jews are only heirs to the Son through the same Spirit, because the claims of the Law (as to who can and cannot belong to God’s people) were abolished in Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross. So, both Jew and Gentile are reconciled in the one body of Christ’s sacrifice on the cross to receive the same promise, if and only if they die to their old ways of life and are re-born in the Christ of self-denial. Through this self-sacrifice we are joined to Christ on the cross, dying to our old sinful ways and born again to the love of our brethren in Christ.

As with the seven tenets of the Bread of Life, Paul gives us the seven unities of life in Christ: the Church of the faithful; Spirit of life; hope in the promise and call of Christ; faith in Christ; Lord, the Bread of Life in the Eucharist; one Baptism in the forgiveness of sins; and one God. Our Creed.
