*A Sunday Reflection

We have been hearing about God's creation in man in the past weeks: how He has "formed us to be imperishable," even God-like, how man's role in creation is to take possession and have dominion over the earth, and now that marriage itself is sacred, as is the priesthood instituted by Jesus, in His bodily sacrifice. So, where is all this going? What is our role as "followers of Christ"?

To answer this question, we must step back a bit and review some of the history behind these words, namely the Old Testament. The All-powerful Ever-living God brought into being the whole universe through His Word, Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ by the nature of His person is one with the Father. By the Father's own words we hear from Heaven: "This is my beloved Son, with whom *I am* well pleased." Ps2:7; Is 42:1; Mt 3:17 These words also refer to Jesus' kingship over heaven and earth including the angelic hosts of heaven. In order that God's creation in man would be understood as God intended it, which is God created man in His own image and nature (imperishable), He had to show us through Jesus Christ, a person (Son of Man) of the same living God. This is the Incarnation of God for the sake of man; for him to identify with body and soul. The Son of God and the Son of Man are brought into union through the person of Jesus Christ. It is God Himself who elevates man to Himself (Ps 8:5-7) and makes him God-like if he obeys His Commandments and does His will.

This is where the hard part starts. We must accept God's will in our lives including the suffering that we share for our brethren for the sanctification of the world and especially those who are in most need of His mercy. So, He created us to be more than angels through our inheritance in Jesus Christ, yet left us with the will to choose His love over the love of the possessions of this world that He created for us. Does that make sense?

This is why we know that Christ's Passion was for us to understand the will of the Father through suffering and sacrifice and to allow our lives to be guided by His love for us. Through the suffering and sacrifice for our brethren, we learn obedience. So, "He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin. Therefore, He is not ashamed to call them 'brethren,' saying: 'I will proclaim your name to my brethren, in the midst of the assembly [of God] I will praise you.' (Ps 22:23)" Heb 2:11

Marriage is no different in its sacrifices and suffering for one another and family. "**Therefore, what God has joined together [be it male and female, child in the mother's womb, body and soul, heaven and earth], let no human put asunder!**" Mk 10:9
