

The Blue and the Gray

The boys of Georgetown College Boat Club had a problem.

The 1876 rowing season was upon them, and, unlike their rivals-Harvard and Penn State-Georgetown had no distinctive colors to help their fans on shore identify them. To solve the problem, they formed a committee and weighed their options.

Their decision? Blue and gray. The blue would represent the students from the Northern states, the gray would represent the students from the Southern states, and

together the two colors would represent the unity of the students on campus, a unity that just 10 years before seemed unthinkable.

Georgetown, the oldest Catholic and Jesuit institution in the United States, had nearly closed its doors in the immediate wake of the Civil War. Nearly 1,200 students and alumni had fought in the conflagration, and in 1861 the U.S. Army took over the university's campus to house Union soldiers. By 1869, its graduates numbered exactly seven.

The Jesuits who ran the school, however, were determined to see it survive. The land for the college had been purchased on January 23, 1789 by America's first bishop, the Jesuit John Carroll, and since then, Catholic men from across the country had worked hard to attend the school.

In 1873, Father Patrick Francis Healy assumed the presidency of the college. Some thought he would close its doors. Healy, however, became like a second founder, erecting new buildings, reforming the curriculum, and improving alumni relations. Within a decade, the school was on sure footing once more.

Today, Georgetown University educates more than 7,000 undergraduate and 9,000 post-graduate students. Considered one of the most prestigious schools in the country, with more than 23 Rhodes Scholars, a U.S. President, and dozens of civic and cultural leaders on its alumni rosters, its blue and gray colors still represent the university and its 23 intercollegiate teams.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a quiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters.

But are we mindful — truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."

We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word.

So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of God — giving it true spirit and life.
