FROM THE PASTOR

As it wasn't a Holy Day this year, I thought I would put in the bulletin my "SSJP Year in Review" New Year's Homily I gave last week, for those who didn't hear it. Happy and Blessed New Year! God bless, Fr. Woolley

Homily — Mary Mother of God MMXXII

Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart. In today's gospel, we see the Blessed Mother looking back on the past year and reflecting on all the many great and wonderful blessings God had given her: her marriage to St. Joseph, the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel that God wanted her to be the mother of his divine Son, the Visitation to Saint Elizabeth, the journey to Bethlehem, and finally the birth of God's Son and her Son in a manger, and the visit from the shepherds who told her of the angels announcing Jesus' birth.

Mary reflected on all these blessings, and kept them in her heart, as she faced the year ahead. And each year, it's good for us to prayerfully reflect back on the past year, and see the many ways the Lord has blessed us, our families and our parish. So every year in my New Year's homily, I look back on the past year at Saints John and Paul and thank the Lord for all he has done for us.

Of course, the big news event of this past year, besides the presidential election (which I'm not going to comment on, thank you very much!), is the pandemic. With the advent of the coronavirus vaccine, things got a little more back to normal at our parish: more and more people began to return to Church, we slowly brought back more parish groups and CCD students to in person meetings and started having Coffee Hours again; in the Spring, we finally started having in person daily mass in the chapel; in June, Bishop Tobin reinstated the obligation to attend Sunday mass unless one was sick or had an underlying condition; and in October we had our snowflake Bazaar indoors like usual. Oh, and I shouldn't forget that this past Holy Thursday, I finally let my mom come back to Church, after having gotten her 2nd Moderna shot! And also on August 8, we brought back the 7:30 AM Sunday Mass, which made a lot of early risers very happy (I wasn't one of them by way!). We still however are dealing with the virus, and so we continue to pray for an end to this pandemic and for all who have lost loved ones or whose lives have been severely affected by it.

Fr. Grenon says we should put a revolving door on the Associate Pastor's room in the Rectory, and again this past July we said goodbye to our Fr. Brendan Rowley, and welcomed our new associate pastor Fr. Doan Nguyen. We also this year we were very happy to see one of our parishioners, Nicholas Whitaker, enter the seminary of Our Lady of Providence, and we continue to pray for him as he discerns God's will for his life. By the way, this coming October, our other seminarian from the parish, Patrick Ryan will God willing be ordained a Deacon in Rome, so please keep Patrick in your prayers as well.

Also this past year, we did a number of upgrades at the parish. Over the summer, we put a new roof on the school, which was a bit of a miracle as due to the building materials shortage, the roofers almost weren't able to do it, but they were able to take materials from another job to get it done while school was out. We also renovated our Daily Mass Chapel in the Rectory, putting new carpeting in as well as hardwood flooring in the sanctuary, and we moved the tabernacle to the center, like we did here at the Church a year ago. I want to thank everyone who made a gift or pledge to the 2019 Grateful for God's Providence Capital Campaign for making these projects possible; we still have more Grateful for God's Providence Projects in the pipeline for this coming year.

Also at the school, we finally completed our outdoor multi sport court project which we had planned on doing before Covid hit: in the Spring, we installed the colorful basketball/volleyball/badminton/pickle ball/Mini tennis court, with funds from the last year's annual Alumni Appeal. Then over the summer, we installed top of the line, in ground Bison basketball hoops, with regulation size NBA glass backboards, and only just a month ago, we finally finished installing the black chain link fence and 10 foot high backstops which enclose the court, all with funds from this past year's School Auction.

Speaking of our school, Fr. John V. Doyle continued to thrive during the pandemic this past year, with an increase enrollment for the 3rd year in a row, and while we continue to be challenged by the virus, especially this new Omicron variant, the Lord has really blessed our school throughout this pandemic, thanks in large part to our wonderful principal Kevin Peloquin and our great teachers and staff.

The major event at our parish this past year of course was the passing of our beloved Father John Duggan on November 4th. Fr. JD had served as a senior priest in residence at Saints John and Paul for the past 24 years. And with the help of his sister, our parish staff and many parishioners and friends, we were blessed to be able to keep him comfortable here at the rectory until the Lord came to bring him home.

Father JD passed away as the church was wrapping up the Year of Saint Joseph, which ended this past December 8th. In honor of the Year of St. Joseph, we bought a statue of Saint Joseph to put in the school's main hallway, and when father JD saw it, he bought one just like it for the parish, and just a week before he passed away, we installed this beautiful candle shrine to St. Joseph in Father's memory.

My brothers and sister, may we keep all these and many other blessings of this past year in our hearts, and as we begin this New Year of Grace 2022, let us look to Mary our Mother, and consecrate ourselves and this New Year to her Immaculate Heart, trusting that Jesus her Son will continue to bless and protect us, our families, our parish, our nation, and our world this New Year.
