From the Pastor

Below is what I said at all the Masses last weekend, for those who didn't hear it, as well as an update on Fr. Doan. Please pray for Fr. Doan, for Jan, and for a new music director! God bless, Fr. Woolley

I have two very important announcements to make.

The first is that this past week, Jan McMahon informed me that, after much prayer and consideration, she will be stepping down from her position as Music Director and Organist at the end of the month, after 26 years of employment at our parish.

As many of you know, Jan retired from her other job as a Phys. Ed Teacher at the Middle School a year ago, and recently moved to Connecticut, about an hour away from the parish.

Jan's retirement will certainly be a big change for our parish; as I told Jan, after getting a new Pastor, the biggest change for a parish is probably getting a new Music Director!

Jan's last weekend here will be Fourth of July Weekend — she says she wants to go out with a Bang! — and after the 9:30am Mass with the choir, we're most probably going to have a little party for her in the hall, no fireworks however! But after that weekend, I'm sure we'll be seeing her here and there filling in at Masses or doing funerals, she's certainly always welcome back at our parish.

I want to take this opportunity to thank Jan for the many years of service to our parish — she actually played at my first Mass here, the day after I was ordained, 23 years ago next Monday — and especially for these past four years while I've been pastor;

Jan has always been very easy to work with, and it's clear to everyone that this isn't just a job for you, but a ministry, so thank you for everything, and may the Lord bless you in your retirement!

So please pray for Jan as she begins this new chapter of her life, and please pray for our parish as we begin a new chapter as well, that St. Cecelia, patron saint of musicians, might get us a good new music director!

So that's the first bit of news, the second is going to need your prayers just as much if not more.

As you know, Father Doan has been on vacation for the past month, visiting his family in Vietnam.

He's scheduled to return this Thursday, but unfortunately, Father Doan was denied a new Visa by the U.S. Consulate in Vietnam.

Father Doan has gone for three interviews, and all three times the Consulate denied him. The Diocesan Immigration Office can't understand why he was denied, as Father Doan has an R-1 Work Visa which is valid until May 2023. Furthermore, Father Hiep the other the Vietnamese priest had no problem renewing his Visa at the same Consulate, when he went to Vietnam back in February.

The diocese and our parish have sent to the consulate documents to prove that Father Doan is employed here, and we even contacted Senator Jack Reed's office to ask for his assistance, as this has worked in the past, but none of this has helped.

According to Father Doan, they are saying he needs to be a priest for 2 years before they will approve his Visa, which according to our immigration expert makes no sense.

So what all this means is, Father Doan is stuck in Vietnam, and barring a miracle, it doesn't look like he'll be back anytime soon.

I'm meeting with the Bishop this coming week to see if we can if the diocese can give us another priest, but the problem is, there's not a lot of priests to go around.

So please pray for Father Doan, that he might be able to come back soon to the United States, and continue to minister in our diocese, and pray also that, in the meantime, the diocese would send us a priest to live here and help out at Saints John and Paul.

And please pray for me; three years ago, we had three full time priests in this parish; right now, I'm it! This coming week we have 4 funerals, and we get emergency calls for last rites almost every other day; I barely have any time to audition any new organists!

Lastly, on a personal note, when I first heard about Father Doan, one of my biggest concerns after Fr. Doan's well being was my upcoming vacation in July, which I had all planned to go on with four other priests. If I'm going to be all alone running this place, I better get a good vacation in this summer!

Thankfully, I managed to get coverage for all the daily and weekend Masses, and even for any funerals that might come in, while I'm away for 10 days in July.

Well, they say things happen in threes, and while Jan was in my office early this past week, giving me the news about her retirement, my secretary called on the intercom, and said the person who's house I'm renting — in Montana — was on the phone, telling me that all the roads in the town are flooded, all the bridges washed out, they've evacuated everybody in the town I'm going to, which is 25 miles from Yellowstone.

So first Fr. Doan, then Jan, and now there goes my vacation!

But thankfully, my friends and I managed to rent another house in a different part of the country, that isn't under a disaster declaration, so my vacation is still a go!

And I'm sure that, just as the Lord got me through my mini vacation crisis, he's going to get our Parish and Fr. Doan through this crisis of his being stuck in Vietnam, and I'm sure the Lord is also going to provide our parish with a good new music director, and be with Jan as she starts a new chapter in her life.

Update on Fr. Doan's situation: The Diocese has reached out to Representative James Langevin to see if he can help (as this bulletin goes to press on Tuesday, we are still awaiting word from his office), and the Diocese is also looking into hiring an immigration lawyer as well. In the meantime, I (Fr. Woolley) met with Bishop Evans, who stated that if it appears that Fr. Doan will be in Vietnam long term before he is able to return, then the Diocese will assign us another associate pastor in the interim. We may also be getting a senior priest of the Diocese, who will be living at the Rectory and ministering in our parish. More info to come!

Thank you to Fr. Henry, Fr. Grenon and Fr. Woolley. Each very different from the other but all wonderful to work with. 
