

Dear Faithful of Saints John and Paul Parish,

Today marks my final weekend with all of you. Though this assignment has flown by, it certainly has been jam-packed. Please allow me, if I may, a few moments of reflection and thanksgiving.

Over these past 10 weeks, I have been privileged to experience countless Masses and Communion calls, Anointings and Funerals, time spent teaching CCD and visiting students at the school, Baptisms and Weddings and the preparations there for, one Multi-Ethnic Potluck Parish Feast Day Celebration, and even 10 days without a full-time priest. I intentionally use the word privilege, because it is truly remarkable how gracious and accommodating people have been. I was, to most of you, a total stranger when I first arrived here. Now, even among those of you whom I have not met, there is a bond of experiences that will never cease. It amazes me that total strangers would welcome me into their church and even in some cases into their homes, just because I tell them that I'm studying to be a priest of Jesus Christ. Whatever the cost has been personally, the benefits for me and for everyone I've worked with have more than made up for it.

Fr. John V. Doyle School Accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges

Dear Families of Saints John and Paul Parish,

I pray that this letter finds you well and enjoying the summer months! As many of you know, the Diocese of Providence recently commemorated its 150th Anniversary. To honor and commemorate the anniversary, the Diocese chose Psalm 126 which reads in part, *"the Lord has done great things for us, we are filled with joy."*

And, while these are undoubtedly challenging times in our world and particularly in the world of education, the Lord has indeed done great things not only in the Diocese of Providence, but also right here at Father John V. Doyle School.

Despite challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the school continues to grow in service of our mission of providing all students with a solid, well-rounded Catholic education in a safe and nurturing environment. Over the past three years, through the generosity of parishioners like you, the support of our families, and the tireless efforts of our teachers and staff, the school has:

Updated a range of curriculum materials and textbooks including a new reading program and materials for kindergarten through fifth grade students, a new English language arts program for sixth through eighth grade students, and a new religion curriculum for first through eighth graders.

Expended our resource services to support students with diverse learning needs, including the hiring of a full-time resource provider.

Improved school facilities including a brand new roof, an outdoor multi-sport court, the creation of the Ted Emmott Learning Center, and the installation of brand new student desks and chairs in our eighth grade and second grade classrooms, with plans to continue furniture upgrades throughout all classrooms in the coming years.

Drafted a detailed four-year strategic plan to help focus our collective vision for the continued growth and success of our school and its mission.

Truly, the Lord has done great things at Father Doyle. And, praise God, it is because of this that our school continues to grow, with enrollment steadily increasing over each of the past three years, recently reaching the highest total enrollment since the 2016-2017 school year.

With that being said, the school currently has limited openings in select grade levels.
