Our Lady of the Rosary



The Battle of Lepanto was a five-hour naval battle between the main fleet of the Ottoman Empire and the fleet of the Holy League, a group of maritime states of southern European Catholic countries. It was fought on October 7, 1571, in the northern waters off the coast of Greece. The Ottoman Empire fleet was defeated by the Holy League.

Pope Pius V knew that the forces of the Holy League were much smaller than the fleet of the Ottoman Empire. Consequently, the pope called on all of Christian Europe to pray the rosary for success against the Ottomans. He led a rosary procession in Rome for this success. After the defeat of the Ottomans at Lepanto on October 7, he called for a feast day in honor of the defeat and called the day Our Lady of Victory. In 1573, Pope Gregory XIII changed the title of the feast to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. Then two centuries later Pope Clement XI extended the feast to all the Latin Rite, laid it in the Roman Catholic Calendar of Saints in 1716, and placed it on the first Sunday in October.

When we celebrate Our Lady of the Holy Rosary this fall, remember all the fallen soldiers of all the wars. Pray for peace and for the reign of Christ to bring all people into right relationships.

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Dear Friends,

*The day has finally arrived ... 98 days after we began the interior renovation of the church we are finally moving back "home"! (July 9 - October 14). It was such a joy to be able to announce that last weekend. Let me say, first, that the pictures really don't tell the whole story. They do not do justice to the beauty of the church as it is now.*

*I mentioned last weekend that we will only have ONE Sunday Mass next weekend. The weekend schedule will include 3pm Confessions and 4pm Mass on Saturday October 13th. On Sunday, CCD will remain as usual but there WILL NOT BE AN 8am Sunday Mass on October 14th. Sunday 8am, October 14th, MASS IS CANCELLED. Sunday October 14th, 10:30am Mass will be the grand opening of the newly renovated church. We will begin in the parish hall and process with the Blessed Sacrament into the new church via the front door (Sugarloaf St entrance).*

**PROCESSION:** *The procession will move out to the sidewalk - altar servers will lead the way followed by some members of the choir, the congregation and lastly myself carrying the Blessed Sacrament. We will process outside, down to Sugarloaf St and enter via the front doors of the church. Once inside the church, find a place to sit. I will then place the Eucharist in the Tabernacle and continue Mass as usual.*

*If there is bad weather, we will enter via the side entrance of the church - by the parking lot. Again, follow the altar servers.*

**AFTER MASS:** *We will hold a light reception with coffee and snacks available. Please stay after Mass to celebrate this wonderful day in the history of our parish.*

*A word of gratitude is owed to all of you who have made this possible. Your generosity, in responding to the needs of our parish - spiritually and financially - have made this little community come alive. I am deeply grateful.*
