Truly living as Jesus taught often comes with great self-sacrifice, self-emptying, and possibly leaving the things of this world behind. Are we ready to pursue this kind of life? God wants us to live and love abundantly not superficially. Love asks that we extend ourselves beyond the status quo and the bare minimum and venture into that which is risky, countercultural, and even radical. What we possess can no longer be important. When Jesus laid this out before the rich young man, he went away sad because he had much. When Jesus lays it out before us, how do we react?

Dear Friends,

It is good to be home! We are finally back in the church and it is amazing! I do hope that you think that the church is beautiful as well. Our spiritual home ought to be something that bespeaks the dignity of a place worthy to call a house of worship. I would like to take a moment here to explain the concept behind the color scheme.

First, we tried to pull colors from the back wall of the sanctuary in order to create greater consistency throughout the whole church. The pillars match the columns, the gray trim matches the gray on the back wall, as well as the cream color walls match the cream on the back wall as well. St. Stanislaus got a bit of a touch up too.

Second, the niches behind the statues of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and that of Mary are also significant. The niches provide for us a "window to heaven" as if the saints "poke their heads out" and call us to our eternal home. Also, when looking at old pictures of the church, I noticed that there was at one time a similar image behind these statues. I wanted to bring something of the old into the new. Our thanks goes out to our own parishioner, Jeremiah Patterson, for his wonderful work on creating these niches.

Third, the altar rails - these 2 magnificent pieces come from St. James and were being stored in a basement. We took them, refinished them and installed them here. Again, to bring back something of the old into the new. My thanks to Bob Fydenkevycz for the donation and to Rick Russo for refinishing them - they look amazing!

Fourth, the stations of the cross were cleaned up and refinished - again through the expertise of Jeremiah Patterson. We also had a 2 inch riser installed under the altar raising it up just a bit - thanks to the talents of Stanley Stokarski.

Lastly, the blue ceiling. Yes, it is a total change! To be honest, I wanted to paint the ceiling this color from day one. The blue is significant of the night sky. The beams, painted white represent the clouds, and if you look close at the gold, where the beams meet, are representative of the stars. Thus, there is a celestial feel, as if when we look up to the sky, we look up to heaven.

All in all, the building of the church is meant to make us feel like we have stepped into heaven, like we have been taken someplace else, invited to another realm beyond this world. It is my sincere hope that we have created that feeling with this new, fresh look. And I have you all to thank for making this a reality! Not only for your financial contributions but for those who put their mark on this new look with the talents that have been giving to them by God. Thank you one and all! And remember to please continue to be generous, there is more to be done!!
