LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"Repent, and believe in the gospel." Some type of honest and sincere repentance is necessary for any type of authentic growth and maturity. We have to come to the realization, unless we are happy wallowing in immaturity and superficiality, that the way we have been doing things is not the best or the healthiest. There isn't a human being alive who hasn't acted foolishly or erratically at the cost of almost losing a treasured relationship. "Why did I act that way?" is a question we often ponder after some reflection and enlightenment.

Faith works the same way. Stumbling through life and bumping up against meaninglessness, a person can begin to see that something significant is missing. They see that there is merit to a relationship with God and an embrace of faith. Before these can take root, sincere sorrow for past wrong doing, missed opportunities, errors in judgment, and short sightedness is necessary. Repentance is necessary. Then having realized that we were walking in darkness, we can rejoice that by God's grace we now see the light.

IMPORTANT DIRECTIVES REGARDING DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY (FEBRUARY 17)

In order to accommodate as many people as possible in a safe and reverent manner, the distribution of ashes will be done differently this year. I have outlined the details below:

- Everyone who attends Mass or a Liturgy of the Word on Ash Wednesday, must register beforehand the same way we handle weekend Masses. Therefore, reservations are required.
- We will begin taking reservations on <u>Monday</u>, <u>February 1</u>. You may call Monday through Thursday, 9:30am 3:30pm. If you receive the auto attendant, you can leave a message, but your reservation is not confirmed until we return your call. The office number is 203-336-1835. We will be taking reservations up until 3:30pm on Tuesday, February 16.

To ensure the safety of clergy and the lay faithful, the following has been instituted for receiving ashes.

- The dry ashes will be sprinkled on the crown of the head.
- When coming forward for the ashes, please follow the same process as Communion, after which please return to your pew via the center aisle.

7:45am, Mass - Holy Family
Noon, Mass - St. Emery
5:30pm, Liturgy Of The Word - Holy Family
