**FROM THE PASTOR,
REVEREND CANON JOEL ESTRADA**

Dear Faithful,

We will solemnly bless our Epiphany Water today after the 10:30am Mass!

We have just concluded the octave of Christmas and are about to enter into Epiphany tide. Tomorrow, we celebrate the **Epiphany of our Lord** (January 6) and Jesus's manifestation of Himself as God and Lord of the world. Let us contemplate on the journey of the Three Magi for when they saw the Star in the East, they immediately set out. They had no doubts: their unbounded faith was strong and sure. They did not hesitate at the prospect of the trials of a long journey for they had generous hearts. They did not postpone their journey, for their souls were ready.

Often we see a star appearing in our souls, which is the inspiration from God urging us to greater generosity and calling us to a life of closer union with Him. Like the Magi, we too must follow our star with faith, promptness, and selfless generosity. If we allow it to guide us, it will certainly lead us to God; it will bring us to the One whom we are seeking.

The three Kings did not give up their quest even though for a time the star disappeared from their sight as they journeyed closer to Jerusalem and then to Bethlehem. We should follow their example and their perseverance, even when we are in interior darkness, without a star to guide us. This is a trial of faith that is overcome only by the exercise of pure faith. We know that God wills it, and we know that God is calling, and that should suffice for us. Saint Paul says, "I know whom I have believed. No matter what happens, I shall trust Him."

In this spirit let us accompany the Magi to adore the newborn Infant King. As they brought forth from among their treasures mystical gifts, let us from our hearts bring forth something fit to offer Him.

**EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION OF MOVEABLE FEASTS
NOVERITIS, FRATRES CARISSIMI!**

The following text will be chanted after the Gospel on the feast of the Epiphany tomorrow.

Know, dearly beloved Brethren, that by the mercy of God, as we have been rejoicing in the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so also do we announce unto you the joy of the Resurrection of the same our Savior. Septuagesima Sunday will be on the 9th day of February. Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the fast of most holy Lent will be on the 26th day of February. On the 12th day of April we shall celebrate with joy the holy Pasch of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ will be on the 21st of May. The Feast of Pentecost on the 31st of May. The Feast of Corpus Christi on the 11th of June. On the 29th day of November will occur the first Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom are honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.
