NEW GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING MASS

As of June 6, 2021 the celebration of Holy Mass will return to normal following these guidelines:

- 1) Masks are optional and may be worn at the discretion of each individual. Those who have not been vaccinated are strongly encouraged to continue to wear masks.
- 2) Seating at our discretion will continue to accommodate those who feel it is beneficial to have social distancing.
- 3) Those who are ill and infirm are dispensed from attendance at Mass and should only attend when well or with proper assistance.
- 4) Bringing up the offertory gifts remains suspended.
- 5) The exchange of the Sign of Peace remains suspended.
- 6) The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended.

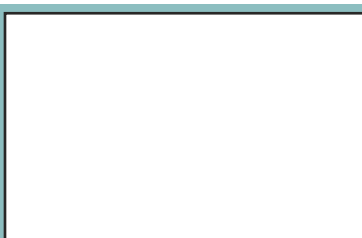
We celebrate on Tuesday the great Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. The importance of this day for the Church and for Christendom would be akin to the importance of Independence Day for our nation. In Rome, and other parts of the world, their feast day is a holy day of obligation! While the Church is founded upon Christ, she was built by the witness to Christ given by St. Peter and St. Paul. As Scripture tells their stories, each man was broken by his weakness and sinfulness. However, each did not allow his life to be defined by his brokenness and weakness. They chose to be defined by their trust in the Lord's merciful love. Each man went to Christ and in Christ became a new creation; transformed from weak to strong, fearful to brave, rash speaking to speaking the kerygma of The Kingdom.

As we approach the anniversary of our nation's freedom, we Americans, regardless of faith, would do well to imitate the virtues of Sts. Peter and Paul. It can be easy to speak rashly in these days of high political and social tensions. We would be better Americans, and Christians, if

we exercised restraint in speech and were more eager to listen and to hear the views of others. It does not mean we have to change our views, but that we can share ideas and contrary views in the spirit of noble brotherhood. Such discussions are more likely to lead to understanding and respect when we can agree to disagree and walk away as friends rather than as enemies!

As Americans, we should be proud that we are free to worship and free to exercise speech with charity. We have the right to allow our voices to be heard. As Christians, we exercise speech always with the hope to make the Lord's voice heard and known. As Catholics, we should be proud that we carry on the legacy of Sts. Peter and Paul. May we do so honorably and well, and like them, see first The Kingdom and Its Righteousness!

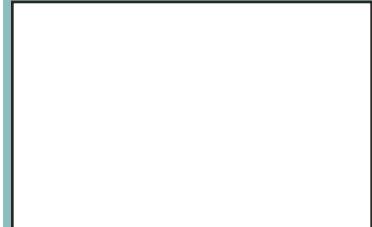
