Question:


Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?

Answer:

A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call. **©LPi**



In this final week of Christmas, we celebrate the gift of two American saints. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, a convert to the faith, was a wife and mother of five children who lived at the turn of the 19th century. Upon the death of her husband, she entered religious life and founded the first Catholic Schools in the United States. She is entombed at her Basilica Shrine in Emmitsburg, Maryland. St. John Neuman was bishop of Philadelphia in the 1850's and was known for his ministry to immigrants and for the growth of the Church in Philadelphia. He is entombed at his Shrine in Philadelphia. Having been gifted with first class relics of each of these saints, their Masses will be celebrated this week while venerating their bodies which spent their life's blood serving Christ, His Church, and making the Christmas mystery bear fruit in the early years of our nation.

Christmas is always a short season. This year, as the calendar falls, Christmas is only fifteen days! Yet, the Mystery of Christ's birth has once again made itself known to a weary world and to hearts who yearn for light in the midst of darkness. The joy of Christmas is to know Jesus as my Rock, my fortress and my deliverer (Psalm 18). The joy of the saints, like Mother Seton and Bishop Neumann, was to do everything for Christ. They worked to bring Christ to people and to bring

people to Christ. They worked so that those they served might come to know Jesus, and to know that at Christmas He was born for them. The full joy of Christmas is when we see Christ become present in the lives of others and to know His presence, He is here in the midst of us, through that presence borne in them.

Next Sunday I will also begin my second semester studying Ecclesial Management and Administration. This first course of the Spring Semester will require me to make a journey to Texas! Our class will take place within the confines of Houston's St. Mary's seminary. Basically, after morning prayer and Mass, we will be in the classroom in the morning, afternoon, and early evening. course takes places over a semester; so this course taking place in a week's time will be demanding, but a great opportunity to meet the other priests with whom I have been working via online communications. I know we have two priests who will travel from Guam, one priest who will travel from Slovenia, and the remaining nineteen of us from all parts of the U.S. Please pray that the Lord will bless our travel, our learning, our fraternal fellowship, and know that we will pray for all of our parishioners and parishes.
