Today, we celebrate Sunday of the Word of God, which our Holy Father Francis inaugurated a few years ago. Every Mass has the proclamation of the Word before the Word becomes flesh in the Eucharist. So, in reality, every day the Word is given to us to read and to ponder so that the Word may speak anew to us. The Daily Mass readings are frequently listed in the bulletin. An easier way to find them is to bookmark a web page such as EWTN or USCCB where we can read the Word each day. Because the Mass is the center of the Church's life, these readings are a common way through which we can all be united in prayer, listening to the voice of the Lord, and reflecting together on what the Spirit is saying to us on any given day of the year. If you cannot attend Daily Mass, reading the Word from the day's Mass is a great way to stay in touch with the Church, the parish, and in communion with your siblings in Christ.

As we are focusing on the Word, I need to remind our Lectors of one very important teaching that I make a part of all my training sessions!! There is one thing we who proclaim God's Word to the assembly should never, ever say!

What could this be? When we make a mistake such as beginning the incorrect reading, or mispronouncing a word, or have to cough or sneeze, we should NEVER say "EXCUSE ME" or "SORRY"! We may think we need to apologize; but in truth calling attention to the inadvertent miscue is far more distracting and noticeable than if we simply continued on with the Word as if nothing occurred! When we interject our own "words" into the proclamation of The Word, we distract from The Word and draw more attention to our "words". So please, out of Reverence for the Word which we proclaim, allow Him to speak through us as we are.

Finally, as a lector pointed out to me recently, their numbers are growing thin! I suppose we could eliminate a Sunday Mass, and therefore need fewer lectors and allow those who do lector to have less responsibility. However, this would be an embarrassing reason for me to present to the bishop as the reason for eliminating a Mass: "Bishop, the lectors are complaining that their numbers are too thin. To make it easier on their workload, the only reasonable solution is to eliminate a Mass." There is a better solution for the parish for this situation, and many others, it is time for new people to step up to the plate! If you are interested in Proclaiming the Word of God, please introduce yourself to one of our lectors after Mass and ask them to walk with you and to help prepare you to be the Voice for the Word of God! Problem Solved!!
