

As I mentioned in my letter of last week, this weekend we begin the 8:00 a.m. "sung" Mass. We'll work up to singing even more than is currently planned, but I first want us to get used to the Antiphons in the places typically occupied by hymns. I would encourage you to be open to what singing the Antiphons does in terms of imparting very specifically-intended graces as they amplify the themes of the Scripture readings (especially the Gospels) each week. Such openness is very conducive to recognizing the Mass as a prayer. I wrote last week that the Antiphons help make the difference between singing the Mass and singing at Mass. Even more so, they help make the difference between praying the Mass and praying at Mass. Praise God for this "new" vehicle of His Grace to us, which deepens and strengthens the Grace of the gift of Himself to us in the Eucharist much more.

Saint Faustina Kowalska Feast Day October 5

Apostle of Divine Mercy, Sister Faustyna Kowalska, of the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, was born on August 25, 1905, in Glogowiec, Poland. Having felt a calling to religious life from the age of 7, her parents refused permission for her entry into a convent. A vision of the Suffering Christ impelled her to seek a place in Warsaw. On August 1, 1925 she entered the



Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw.


She lived in the Congregation for 13 years, staying in various houses, working as a cook, shop assistant in a baker's shop, gardener, & portress. She stayed for 8 months in a hospital, suffering from tuberculosis of the lungs & alimentary system, offering her sufferings as a voluntary sacrifice for sinners and as the Apostle for the Divine Mercy.

Sister's principle task was to pass onto the Church and the world the Message of Mercy, of God's Merciful Love for every human being, and calling each of us to entrust our lives in Him, & actively love our neighbor. Jesus gave her new forms of worship: the picture inscribed with "Jesus, I trust in You", the Feast of Divine Mercy, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, & the Hour of Mercy. She died October 5, 1938, aged 33. The Holy Father, John Paul II, canonized her on April 30, 2000. The Apostolic Movement of the Divine Mercy continues to grow. (Edited from www.saint-faustina.org)
