



#### **Daily Mass and Snow Days**





## IMPORTANT OBSERVANCES FOR THE SEASON OF LENT

Lent began on Ash Wednesday, March 2, and goes until the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 14. During the season of Lent the Church calls all Catholics to observe the teachings below:

#### **FAST & ABSTINENCE:**

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday March 2 and April 15 are days of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the Universal Church.
- Every Friday of Lent All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (from meat) in the Church in the United States.
- ❖ The Law of Abstinence Binds Catholics aged 14 and older.
- ❖ The Law of Fasting Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59).

#### **EASTER DUTY:**

According to *Code of Canon Law*, 920 §1-2, after being initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year (§1). This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time during the year. In the United States, the Easter Season is from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday (§2).

In conjunction with Easter Duty Cannon 920 is the **second precept-**-"You shall confess your sins at least once a year"-which ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness (CCC 1457).



During COVID, many people are finding themselves struggling to feed their families and pay their rent. Last year, our parishioners generously donated over 3,000 pounds of food to the 40 Cans for Lent campaign

sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Councils #8144 and #11747. Our goal this year is 5,000 pounds.

Donate in either of two ways:

- 1. Drop food off when you come to weekday or weekend Masses. Barrels have been placed in the narthex of each church.
- 2. Deliver your donation directly to South Portland Food Cupboard (13 Thaddeus Street, South Portland).

Let's be generous, helping the Food Cupboard realize their motto: "Feeding Neighbors in Need".

This Lenten season, set aside a few minutes each day for reflection and prayer. Lenten books for children, adults, families, and teens can be found
