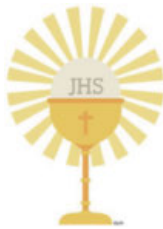

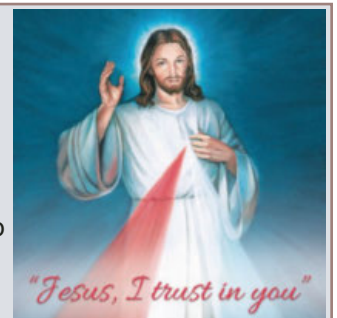
Divine Mercy Sunday

Holy Week

Holy Week is the most sacred time in the Catholic Church, commemorating the final days of Jesus Christ's life, His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

We begin with Palm Sunday, celebrating Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, when the crowds greeted Him with palm branches. It is striking how quickly these crowds turn on Jesus, as seen in the Gospel reading of His Passion.

In the Diocese of Portland, we celebrate the Chrism Mass on Tuesday of Holy Week. During this Mass, the bishop blesses the oils used throughout the year for the sacraments, and our priests renew their promises. This ticketed event at the Cathedral unites us as a diocese, strengthens our connection to the greater Church.

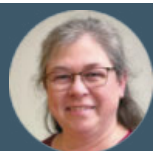
On Holy Thursday, we begin the Triduum, the sacred three-day period leading up to Easter. This is a unified time of worship, where the services flow together as one. We leave the church in silence on Holy Thursday, and this silence continues into Good Friday.

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, where Jesus institutes the Eucharist and the priesthood. After this Mass, the bells remain silent until the Easter Vigil. The ritual of foot washing on this night reminds us of Jesus' command to love one another.

Good Friday is marked by fasting and prayer. This is the only day of the year when Mass is not celebrated. The Good Friday service includes the veneration of the cross and special prayers for the salvation of souls.

Holy Saturday is a day of quiet reflection as we await the Resurrection. The Easter Vigil on Saturday night begins after sunset and is known as the "mother of all vigils." The Mass begins with a bonfire outside and the blessing of the Easter Candle. This also begins the Easter celebration, marking Christ's victory over death and the hope of new life.

We look forward to celebrating Holy Week with all of you as we enter this most sacred time of our Church.

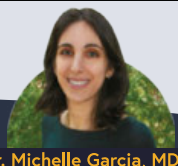
