





For centuries, the Church has cherished the tradition of honoring Mary during the month of May. Pope Pius XII, in his encyclical *Mediator Dei*, called the devotional practices of honoring Mary deeply meaningful.

Pope Paul VI also wrote about the Month of Mary in 1965, calling it a time that brings joy and comfort to the faithful. He encouraged Catholics to turn to Mary in prayer during May, especially asking her to intercede for peace in the world.

More recently, in May 2002, Pope John Paul II reminded us that May is a "Marian" month that continues to be loved by the people of God. He pointed out that parishes and families all over the world keep this tradition alive with special prayers and celebrations.

There are several Marian feast days throughout the month that give us even more reason to celebrate her:

- May 13: Our Lady of Fatima marking the first apparition of Mary to the children in Fatima, Portugal, in 1917.
- May 24: Mary, Help of Christians a title that reminds us of Mary's powerful intercession, especially celebrated by the Salesian family.
- May 31: The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrating the joyful moment when Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth and proclaimed the *Magnificat*.

The month of May is a beautiful opportunity to grow closer to Mary, to reflect on her example of faith, and to ask for her prayers for ourselves and for the world. We invite you to join us in honoring Mary!
